Exercise of the Offsite Radiological Emergency Preparedness

Plans Site-Specific to the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station

Attached are two copies of the final exercise report for the November 17-18, 1987, exercise of the State of Louisiana and local offsite radiological emergency preparedness plans site-specific to the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station. This final exercise report was prepared by the Region VI office staff of the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

There was one deficiency identified during the exercise which related to the inability of both the Louisiana Nuclear Energy Division and the State Emergency Operations Center to initiate a call on the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station hot-line system. This deficiency was previously identified during the 1985 exercise and was subsequently corrected with the installation of new telephone equipment by the utility. The cause of the hot-line system malfunction during the November 1, .8, 1987, exercise has been corrected, the system has been thoroughly tested, and all communications personnel have been trained. Therefore, the deficiency which existed during the November 17-18, 1987, exercise has been resolved and the FEMA Region VI office staff are confident that no remedial drill is required. There were a few areas requiring corrective actions identified and a schedule of corrective actions is included in the exercise report for these.

Based on the results of the exercise and corrective actions mentioned above, the Louisiana S'ate and local offsite radiological emergency plans and preparedness remain adequate to provide reasonable assurance that appropriate measures can be taken offsite to protect the health and safety of the public in the event of an accident at the Grand Gulf Nuclear Station and the 44 CFR 350 approval granted on June 29, 1983, remains in effect.
