This confirms the telephone conversations between you and Ms. N. E. Clark of Virginia Electric and Power Company and Mr. A. J. Ignatonis of my staff on March 25 and April 1, 1986, concerning an enforcement conference to be conducted in the Region II Office of April 9, 1986, at 1:30 p.m. We requested this meeting to discuss our findings relative to two events - one involving radioactive materials shipment and the other involving uncontrolled security access at the North Anna facility. The radioactive materials shipment left the North Anna facility and arrived at the Chem-Nuclear's Barnwell, South Carolina facility with an external surface dose rate exceeding the regulatory requirement. With regard to the security event, the concern is that a contractor employee re-entered the site without being challenged by the security officers. A proposed agenda is enclosed.
