
Dear Sir:

SUMMARY

I advised Gary that it appears that no amendment to the license is necessary. He explained who the license manager is and it is a person who may sign NRC correspondence and functions between the Commander and the RSO to manage the license. The position appears to be approximately analogous to a middle manager for a hospital or other corporate entity, who oversees the RSO and may sign off on correspondence for senior management. We do not amend licenses whenever other licensee's middle managers and designated signatories change and we should not do so here. I proposed voiding the action and suggested that the licensee save itself some work next time this position holder changes.

Note that Mr. Mapley is not named on the license. Neither will Ms. Graham^{ly} and we don't need Ms. Graham's resume. I advised Gary to call me if he had any further questions.
