In view from the news media, and other information sources, the Commission has proposed a new rule on requirements new nuclear power plants must meet prior to low-power testing. In view of the recent reports of anticipated power shortages in the eastern U.S., with resulting brownouts and/or blackouts, action in this area is overdue.
