Dear Secretary,

I am very concerned about the one-step licensing of nuclear power plants which the NRC has proposed. The NRC, as I see it, was established to protect the public from unsafe power plants. Up to now, the burden of proof that a nuclear power plant is safe ^{has} rested with the power company building it. State and local officials have had a chance to determine whether safe evacuation of the site was feasible. The one-step licensing would make it up to the public to prove that the plant is unsafe, and very little time is given the public for challenging a plant's safety. The proposal reduces the public's protection from nuclear accidents and dangerous power plants. I am opposed to it. Please do what you can to retain the protections provided by the Atomic Energy Act ensuring public hearings, and to keep
