The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) has issued License No. 16-17316-01E to GE Lighting. This license expires on May 31, 2026. Ownership of GE Lighting's facilities and personnel will be transferred to Consumer Lighting (U.S.) LLC on July 1, 2020.

GE Lighting requests an amendment to the subject license transferring it to Consumer Lighting (U.S.) LLC as the new licensee. In addition, we request that the subject license be amended to remove reference to the facilities located at 150 Loomis Parkway, Ravenna, Ohio 44266 and 3010 Spartanburg Highway, East Flat Rock, North Carolina 28726. The Ravenna and East Flat Rock facilities were sold by GE Lighting to Current Lighting Solutions, LLC (Current) on April 1, 2019. We understand that Current is actively working with the NRC to obtain a license (or licenses) in its own name.

Transfer of Control Information for NRC Review

1. General Electric is selling its GE Lighting business to Savant Systems Inc. Savant will hold the newly acquired business as a subsidiary entity known as Consumer Lighting (U.S.) LLC (EIN: 82-4797551). Savant is a 100% U.S.-owned corporation. The President of Savant is Robert Madonna and the directors are Mr. Madonna, Edward Breslow and Cordell Spencer. The President of Consumer Lighting (U.S.) will be William Lacey.

2. Describe any changes in personnel or duties that relate to the licensed program. Include training and experience for new personnel and any changes in the training program.

No changes in operating personnel or duties with change of ownership.

3. Describe any changes in the location, facilities, equipment, radiation safety program, use, possession, waste management, or other procedures that relate to the licensed program.

We request that the subject license be amended to remove reference to the facilities located at 150 Loomis Parkway, Ravenna, Ohio 44266 and 3010 Spartanburg Highway, East Flat Rock, North Carolina 28726. The Ravenna and East Flat Rock facilities were sold by GE Lighting to Current Lighting Solutions, LLC (Current) on April 1, 2019.

4. Describe the status of the licensee's facilities, equipment, and radiation safety program, including any known contamination and whether decontamination will occur prior to transfer. Include the status of calibrations, leak tests, area surveys, wipe tests, training, quality control, and related records.

There will be no changes in the facilities or equipment to be used in the licensed program and no changes to current operating procedures, including those of the radiation safety program.

5. If current decommissioning funding plans (DFP) will be changed as a result of the transfer, the revised DFP should be submitted. If other financial assurance documents will be changed as a result of the transfer, confirm that all financial assurance instruments associated with the license will be held in the transferee's name before the license is transferred, and as required by 10 CFR 30.35(f), the licensee must, within 30 days, submit financial instruments reflecting such changes.

6. Confirm that all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facility will be transferred to the transferee or to NRC, as appropriate. These records include documentation of surveys of ambient radiation levels and fixed and/or removable contamination, including methods and sensitivity.

7. Confirm that both transferor and transferee agree to transferring control of the licensed material and activity, and the conditions of transfer, and that the transferee has been made aware of any open inspection items and its responsibility for possible resulting enforcement actions.

Consumer Lighting (U.S.) LLC agrees to the transfer of control of the licensed material and its responsibility for the licensed activity under the subject license. Consumer Lighting (U.S.) LLC has been made aware by the transferor of any open inspection items and of its responsibility for any possible enforcement actions, while, at the same time, the transferor provides a commitment to close out all such actions with the Commission before license transfer.

8. Confirm that the transferee will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations, and commitments of the transferor or that the transferee will submit a complete description of the proposed licensed program.

New licensee (Consumer Lighting (U.S.) LLC) will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations, and commitments of the transferor under the subject license.

9. The transferee, in the case of fuel cycle facilities, shall provide documentation showing that it is financially qualified to conduct normal operations. The information can be in the form of income statements and balance sheet forecasts.
