During my employment with LP&L. I normally had weekly meetings with Mr.
James M. Cain, Chief Executive Officer, LP&L. During May and June, 1983, on
several occasions, I generally discussed with Mr. Cain the investigation and
its impact on some existing LP&L policies. I told Mr. Cain about my strength-
ening the site procedures regarding drug and alcohol use and he concurred with
the actions I had initiated. Mr. Cain was concerned about the investigation,
as I was. To the best of my recollection, I told Mr. Cain that I had recom-
mended to Mr. Leddick that Mr. Leddick receive a confidential briefing regarding
this investigation from Friloux and Barkhurst.
I would like to emphasize that at no time was I aware of a decison by
anyone to stop or cover up this investigation. Furthermore, I recall instruc-
ting Barkhurst to brief the NRC Resident Inspector regarding this matter.
I also understood that Friloux would brief the NRC Region IV Safeguards
Inspector concerning this investigation.
