SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR WITHHOLDING 1" ORMATION FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE

By your application dated May 23, 1988 and Westinghouse Electric Corporation's affidavit dated May 2, 1988 you submitted "WCAP-11761, Revision 1, (Proprietary) and WCAP-11762, (Non-proprietary) entitled "South Texas Units 1 and 2 Reactor Vessel Tilt and Waviness Clarification Study" and requested that WCAP-11761, Revision 1, be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790.

You stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

- The information reveals the distinguishing aspects of a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.) where prevention of its use by any of Westinghouse's competitors without license from Westinghouse constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies.
- The information consists of supporting data, including test data, relative to a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.), the application of which data secures a competitive economic advantage, e.g., by optimization or improved marketability.
- The information, if used by a competitor, would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing of a similar product.
- The information reveals cost or price information, production capacities, budget levels, or commercial strategies of Westinghouse, its customers or suppliers.
- 5. The information reveals aspects of past, present, or future Westinghouse or customer funded development plans and programs of potential commercial value to Westinghouse.
