## Gentlemen:

I am writing to strongly urge the Commission to proceed to adopt its proposed clarification of emergency planning requirements for low power license to make clear that a full scale public notification system need not be in place in order for a nuclear power plant to be given a low power license.

As officials most knowledgeable of nuclear power and responsible for the health and safety of the public, I would encourage you to not allow nuclear power opponents or self-serving public officials to stop your efforts in clarifying and eliminating the ambiguities of the present requirements for low power operations.

I understand that with low power operations the risk to public health and safety is significantly lower than at full power. The NRC should make <u>their</u> decision on this proposed rule based on the knowledge of the low risks associated with low power operation and the facts that Seabrook is complete, safe, fueled and ready to go.

I hope that the Commission will continue to pursue its sound administration in the light of its national responsibility and adopt proposed clarification.
