As a residents of Seabrook N.H.
an Parents of 3 children we strongly
oppose the proposed change to its
emergency planning requirements for
fuel loading & low power operation of
nuclear power plants.

Now we have been astounded time
& time again, that an agency that was
developed to Safeguard the public has
developed rules & regulations to comply
with the needs of the Utilities.
For example when the plant needed to
reduce the Evac. area because Mass-
achusetts rejected the plans the NRC was
already to go with these plans. They
only relied on the word of Seabrook
Station officials of the area & how
many people there would die in
the area. They didnt even tell the Comm-
ission there was a breach to the

east of the plant, let alone hundreds of thousands of people there on any given Summer day. I couldn't believe that when making these decisions that not one of the Commissioners who was making a decision that could effect the lives of hundreds of thousands of people could not be bothered to have this information checked out. Again I see a rule change being placed above the Welfare of the public & I can't help but wonder how an agency that is run at taxpayers money for our Safety is so quick to place a utility's interest above ours.

We are tired of seeing constant changes to rules. In 1974 Warren Rudman then Attorney General of N.H. filed to Stop Construction Permits based on the fact that the location of Seabrook with only 1 major access Rt. (95) which is generally

backed up with traffic for 6 or 7 miles during the Summer) is our only hope of getting out. That the heavy Summer traffic at the beaches, and heavy flow of traffic to Ski areas in the Winter provided no clear assurances that the public could safely be evacuated. We were told then the rule was that evacuation was not an issue until the plant was completed. Now it is completed & rules are being changed so that the utility can get its license. I pray to God Somewhere Somewhere wakes up & sees that you people are not doing what you were set up to do. That is to protect public Safety.
