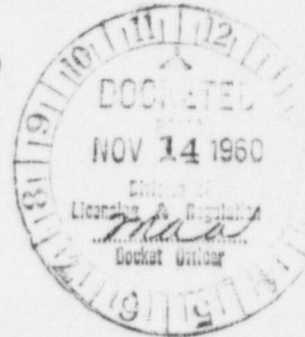

Gentlemen:

The Salt Lake City uranium mill of Vitro Chemical Company, a subsidiary of Vitro Corporation of America, has a new operating program whereby employees follow a repeating 14 day work schedule of 10 consecutive days, followed by 4 days of rest. No change has been made in the hours of work per work week. All employees work a 40 hour work week, commencing at 8:01 a.m. each Sunday. The following table shows the manner in which hours of work are scheduled during the various 7 day periods:
