## 8. MAINTAINING EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

### 8.1 ORGANIZATIONAL PREPAREDNESS

Two kinds of response may be needed in an emergency at Morris Operation, general personnel action (i.e., evacuation of an area), and emergency team response (minimizing consequences and/or taking remedial action).

Quarterly drills are held for general personnel action. The drills are mixed with the various shifts, shift personnel and shift supervisors to achieve across-the-board participation. Emergency Brigade training is conducted periodically. Field training currently includes a fire fighting exercise and a criticality re-entry exercise.

Morris Operation provides training for off-site organizations where assistance agreements exist. These organizations are briefed on the nature of possible emergency situations, communications, and the mechanism of the desired responses. When letters of agreement are renewed, invitations are extended to each organization to attend refresher courses where required, to educate new personnel. These agencies are invited to identify specific training they feel necessary, and arrangements are made to conduct such training.<sup>8-1</sup>

### 8.2 REVIEW AND REVISION OF EMERGENCY PLANS AND PROCEDURES

The emergency plans for Morris Operation are subject to annual review, and revised as required. All written agreements with supporting off-site agencies are renewed every 2 years. Similar practice is applied to related procedures, training plans, etc.

A mutual assistance plan is in effect between Morris Operation and Commonwealth Edison's DNPS. Either party to this plan may support the other with radiation
