In support of our material license application, we hereby submit the following additional information, as requested in your letter dated March 19, 1986.

Item 12:

We clearly commit ourselves to instruct personnel before assuming duties with, or in the vicinity of, radioactive materials; during annual refresher training or whenever there is a significant change in duties, regulations, or the terms of the license, on the following subjects:

- 1. All terms of the license pertinent to radiation safety.
- 2. Areas where radioactive material 1_ used or stored.
- 3. Potential hazards associated with radioactive material.
- 4. Radiological safety procedures appropriate to their respective duties.
- 5. Pertinent NRC regulations.
- 6. Rules and regulations of the laboratory.
- 7. Obligation to report unsafe conditions to the radiation safety officer.
- 8. Appropriate response to emergencies or unsafe conditions.
- 9. Right to be informed of their radiation exposure and bioassay results.
- Locations where notices, copies of pertinent regulations, license and license conditions, license applications and applicable correspondence, have been posted, stored, filed, etc.

Item 19:

The San Juan Health Centre is an out-patient facility, hence no rooms for patient hospitalization are available.

The therapeutic use of radiopharmaceuticals which is been requested is limited to administered doses of less than 30 mCi, hence, patients would be ambulatory.

Treatment of hyperthyroidism would be administered I-131 doses of less than 10 mCi, in capsule form.

This should clarify our request under Group IV.
