NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF A THEFTY TO PACILITY

Notice is hereby given that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 12 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-7 issued to Pacific Gas and Electric Company which revised Technical Specifications for operation of the Humboldt Pay Power Plant Unit No. 3, located near Eureka, California. The amendment is effective as of its date of issuance.

This amendment adds operating limits and requirements to the Technical Specifications to assure safe conduct of a repair to the cracked reactor cleanup system piping discovered "arch 17, 1976.

The application for the amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment is not required since the amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

The Commission has determined that the issuance of this amendment will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant to 10 CFR § 51.5(d)(4) an environmental statement, negative declaration or environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of this ameniment.

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 12 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-7 for the Humboldt Bay Power Plant, Unit 3. The amendment is in response to your request dated March 20, 1976.

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This amendment incorporates into the Humboldt Bay Power Plant, Unit 3, Technical Specifications operating limits and requirements necessary for the safe conduct of repairs to the nonisolable leak in the reactor cleanup system suction piping discovered on March 17, 1976.

Changes to your proposal were necessary to meet our requirements. These have been discussed with your staff.

It is our understanding that a 100% hydrostatic test will be performed following the repairs and prior to power operation. In addition we request that the results of the analysis on the cracked piping and a history of similar pipe failures at Humboldt Bay be submitted within sixty (60) days of the date of this letter.

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This amendment incorporates into the Humboldt Bay Power Plant, Unit 3, Technical Specifications operating limits and requirements necessary for the safe conduct of repairs to the nonisolable leak in the reactor cleanup system suction piping discovered on March 17, 1976.

Changes to your proposal were necessary to meet our requirements. These have been discussed with and agreed to by your staff.

It is our understanding that a 1100 psig hydrostatic test will be performed following the repairs and prior to power operation. In addition we request that the results of the analysis on the cracked piping and a history of similar pipe failures at Humboldt Bay be submitted within sixty (60) days of the date of this letter. This should include analysis and justification that other similar piping will not be subject to similar failures in the near future.

Copies of the related Safety Evaluation and the Federal Register Notice are also enclosed.
