YOUR NOVEMBER 14, 1962 TELEPHONE CONVERSATION WITH MR. R. J. BERTÉ

LR:JGD

I. If LRL wishes to export AEC owned normal uranium which they hold under the exemption of Section 40.11, 10 CFR 40, attached, they are exempt from the Part 40 licensing requirements as far as that export is concerned, subject, of course, to the concurrence of your office, assuming you administer their contract with AEC. In this case the export would be treated as made by AEC and the Shippers Export Declaration should so state.

If LRL as a licensee of the AEC or the State of California wishes to export ten microcuries of normal uranium (in fact, up to three pounds) they may do so under the general license of Section 40.23(a) provided the export is made in accordance with the conditions of that Section. For your information we are also attaching a set of Form AEC-7 so that you will be aware of the information required before consideration is given to issuance of a specific export license. Licenses are not issued to persons exempt from the regulation for activities within the scope of the exemption.

II. The export of radium is not controlled by AEC.

III. Contemporary Metals Corporation, 1039 South San Gabriel Boulevard, San Gabriel, California, was issued on September 25, 1962, Source Material License SMB-654 authorizing possession and use of the uranium and thorium contained in 125,000 tons of residues for stockpiling at Brown Road, Robertson, Missouri, and use at the licensee's processing facility at 7210 Polson Lane, Hazelwood, Missouri. A copy of the license is attached for your information.
