REQUEST FOR AMENDMENT TO U.S. NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION BYPRODUCT Subj:

- 1. It is requested that subject license be amended to allow CAPT Frederick Robert Ellwanger III, MC, USN, to be a user on the teletherapy license. This request is being made because CAPT Ellwanger does not meet the current requirement of the therapy license for Board certification, nor does he meet the 3-year active practice in therapeutic radiology requirement. Information pertinent to this request is attached as enclosures (1) through (5).
- CAPT Ellwanger has just completed a two-year residency program in radiation therapy at Eastern Virginia Medical School, Norfolk, Virginia (enclosure (3)). This program is accredited by the Residency Review Committee of Radiology of the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. His previous experience in pediatrics and Board certifications including Pediatric Hematology-Oncology, enclosure (4), were sufficient to allow him 2 years credit towards ABR Board eligibility in therapeutic radiology, enclosure (5). Having completed his two-year residency program, he is now ABR Board-eligible and has applied to take the boards this year.
- 3. Although CAPT Ellwanger does not meet the training requirement or the Board certification requirement, the Radiation Safety Committee felt that his experience and training were sufficient to qualify him as a user. The committee unanimously recommended that this information be forwarded to the NRC to request a license amendment approving CAPT Ellwanger as a user.
