## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT REQUEST

Dear Mr. Felton:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. 522, as amended, the Nuclear Information and Resource Service requests the following documents regarding the Shearon Harris Plant on behalf of Wells Eddleman, intervenor in the operating license proceedings. Please consider "documents" to include reports, studies, test results, correspondence, memoranda, meeting notes, meeting minutes, working papers, graphs, charts, diagrams, notes and summaries of conversations and interviews, computer records, and any other forms of written communication, including internal NRC Staff memoranda. The documents are specifically requested from, but not limited to, the Office of Inspection and Enforcement (I&E); Office of the Executive Legal Director (OELD); Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR). In your response, please identify which documents correspond to which requests below.

Pursuant to this request, please provide all documents prepared or utilized by, in the possession of, or routed through the NRC related to:

- Allegations made by Frank Peguese regarding construction defects, improper procedures, poor quality assurance or other complaints about the Shearon Harris plant; and
- Instances or allegations of water leaking into the containment, cracking and/or lack of integrity in the basemat, floors, foundations, walls, entrances, penetrations or other parts of the Shearon Harris containment building, equipment storage warehouse, waste processing building, fuel handling building, auxiliary building, turbine building, and diesel generator building.

In our opinion, it is appropriate in this case for you to waive search charges, pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552(a)(4)(A) "because furnishing the information can be considered as primarily
