Gentlemen:

This refers to your request for renewal of your license No. R-231.

In order to continue the review of your removal application, it is necessary that the following information be submitted:

- A detailed description of your organization, including authority and responsibility of each level of management and/or supervision in regard to development, approval, and adherence to operating procedures.
- The qualifications and experience of the personnel in your organization assigned the responsibility for developing, conducting and administering the radiation safety program for the mill.
- 3. A description of the area in which the mill is located including distances to inhabited areas, locations of rivers and sources of water supply for the mill. A topographical map with the above identifications is preferred.
- 4. A description of the method for restricting both the mill and the tailings pond from unmuthorized entry.
- 5. The citimate control or disposition of mill tailings, i.e. discharge into a pond, river, etc. A statement as to whather or not the tailings will ultimately reach a ground water supply; and if so, where the tailings enter such supplies in relation to points of utilisation of the water and expected dilution factors.

- A description of the liquid affluent survey program (if plant affluents reach gra-ed water suppliers), inoluding the number, leantion and frequency of check samples and a step-by-step procedure for sample analysis of urunium and radium.
- A description of the equipment used to remove solid rediscrive material and soluble radius if tailings are discharged directly into a ground or surface water supply.
- A flow diagram of the mill production operation and a diagram of plant layout, indicating areas and points in the process where dust is governted.
- A description of vantilation and dust collection equipment that is utilized, including the type, capacity and locations of such equipment, e.g. ore transfer points, crushing, grinding, etc.
- 10. A description of the survey program which is followed to determine concentrations of sixborne radioactivity within the mill, including the make, model number and capacity of sampling devices, and the step-by-step procedures for sample analysis.
- 11. In the description of your air sampling program, please include:
 - a. A description of the expling location in respect to operating personnel;
 - b. A description of the sampling location in respect to the process operation; and
 - e. The approximate number of sampling locations in each area.
- 12. A description of the procedure followed in determining the everage deily and weekly exposures to airborne radio-activity for each employee who frequently or occasionally occupies areas where air contemination exceeds MPC values specified in 10 CFR 23.

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- 13. If respirators are used as a temporary protective measure, a description of your program for using respiratory protective equipment including type, methods for maintenance and cleaning, the trees of use, and management enforcement of the program.
- 14. A description of mill discharge stacks including stack heights and types of affluent to be discharged, method for controlling release of radioactive material, and methods for determining the concentration of radioactive material released to the environs.
- 15. A description of the method for determining exposure of employees to external radiation.

We note that during the inspection of your milling activities on May 28, 1959, by AEC inspectors, areas in which uranium is used or stored were not posted as specified in Section 20.203(e)(2) and containers in which uranium is used or stored were not labeled as required by Section. 20.203(f)(2) of the AEC's "Standards for Protection Against Endiation," Part 20, Title 10, Code of Faderal Regulations. In this regard, you may wish to make application for examption to the posting and labeling requirements of Sections 20.203(e)(2) and (f)(2). Your request should include proposed procedures for posting all entrances to the mill with signs containing the symbol, coloring and wording specified in Section 20.203(e)(2), and the necessary wording to indicate that containers in restricted areas may contain radiosetive materials.

Enclosed is a sample sign containing the coloring, wording and symbol which meets the requirements of Section 20.203(e) and (f). Signs more suitable for posting and labeling might be procured from a commercial sign company.
