

SUBJECT: COMANCHE PEAK

It has come to my attention that the allegations and technical issues being reviewed by the CPSES Technical Review Team (TRT) do not include the [REDACTED] allegations. Because the [REDACTED] allegations are concerned primarily with substantive technical deficiencies related to specific pipe support designs, whereas the mechanical issues currently being reviewed by the TRT appear to be vague and minor by comparison, we believe that the high level of technical competency on the TRT is not being effectively utilized. We highly recommend that the [REDACTED] issues be included in the TRT scope in order to preclude a rekindling of the issues in the future. We believe to not include them now would be a mistake.

Reference 1 requested action to implement the
Conanche Peak plan for the compilation of outstanding
regulatory actions. This plan was approved by
R. Day Young, H.R. Denton and J.T. Collier on
June 5, 1984 and was intended to assure overall
coordination and integration of all outstanding
regulatory actions regarding Conanche Peak.

These actions encompassed all licensing, inspection,
warning and allegation review. The plan
shows a clear distinction in responsibility
for ~~the~~ 97 allegations in the Civil / Mechanical
area and 19 allegations in the Design Pipe/
Pipe Support area. Responsibility for the
former was assigned to the Conanche Peak
Technical Review Team (TRT) and the

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latter to NRR. Actions regarding: 1) the 97 Civil/Mechanical and 2) the 19 Design Pipe/Pipe Support allegations require resolution of: 1) some 20 pipe support allegations and 2) Applicants' motion for ^{some 21} summary disposition related to Applicants' Plan to respond to the ASLB December 28, 1983, Memorandum and Order, respectively.

Reference 2 recommends that the 19 Design Pipe/Pipe Support (Walsh/Doyle) allegations be transferred to the TRT scope of work. We do not concur with the recommendation for the following reasons:


