One short term contractor tested positive for cocaine and one short term contractor tested positive for alcohol on a pre-access drug/alcohol screen. The contractors were not allowed unescorted access and were provided an opportunity to appeal through the Wisconsin Electric appeal process. There were no appeals and unescorted access was denied for 12 months pending results of drug/alcohol assessment should the individuals reapply for unescorted access at a later date.
