Dear Judge Frye:

In your Memorandum and Order, dated January 7, 1986, in the UF₆ to UF₄ amendment proceeding you directed the NRC staff to provide a report on the circumstances regarding the January 4, 1986 accident at the Sequoyah Facility. Accordingly, enclosed please find a copy of NUREG-1179, Vol. 1, "Rupture of Model 48Y UF₆ Cylinder and Release of Uranium Hexafluoride." The report describes the facts surrounding the accident and any generic or specific safety concerns identified by the NRC's Augmented Investigation Team (AIT). An additional volume to NUREG-1179 is expected to be issued following the completion of ongoing investigations. The Staff will also send you a copy of NUREG-1189, "Assessment of the Public Health Impact From the Accidental Release of UF₆ at the Sequoyah Fuels Corporation Facility at Gore, Oklahoma," as soon as it is published. The Staff believes that NUREG-1179, Vol. 1 and NUREG-1189 satisfy your request for reports on the circumstances of the accident.

The January 7th Order also requested the Staff's conclusions as to the implications of the accident for the pending request to amend the Sequoyah Facility license to authorize the conversion of depleted UF_6 to depleted UF_4 . The Staff is now assessing this question and will advise you shortly of its view as to how this question should be addressed in this proceeding.
