Dear Mr. Crow:

This letter is to inform you that Sequoyah Fuels Corporation's Sequoyah Facility has scheduled a re-survey of on site and off site areas potentially affected by the release of UF<sub>6</sub> on January 4, 1986. This re-survey sampling activity has been scheduled for the week of May 5-9, 1986.

The survey will include area sampling of soils, surface water in ponds and runoff, groundwater monitor wells and vegetation including nearby food crops for uranium and fluoride. Sampling will include those areas noted to be above facility action levels during the sampling immediately after the accident (See NUREG-1189).

Assistance in conducting this survey will be obtained from Dr. Billy Tucker, agronomist affiliated with the Oklahoma Agricultural Extension Service. A veterinarian will assist in obtaining urine samples from selected cattle grazing on Sequoyah Fuels lands adjacent to the facility.

Results of the re-survey program will be provided in a report describing the survey findings and proposals for further sampling and mitigative actions (if any). The report will be submitted by July 15, 1986.

This program addresses those areas proposed for a re-survey study in NUREG-1189, page 77. If you have any questions concerning the proposed program, please contact me at your earliest convenience.
