- The notification for the declaration of an Alert to the Coast Guard was not made during the required timeframe of 15 minutes. (50-440/86009-01; 50-441/86003-01) (Paragraph 5.a.2).
- 2. The inplant team responding to the simulated injured/contaminated man did not provide complete information to the Control Room regarding the accident site situation. (50-440/86009-02; 50-441/86003-02) (Paragraph 5.a.3).
- Procedural criteria for downgrading an Emergency Action Level (EAL) to a lesser level were not considered in downgrading the Action Level, and an unapproved form was utilized in recovery planning. (50-440/86009-03; 50-441/86003-03) (Paragraph 5.b.1).
