SUBJECT: Negotiaved Rulemaking for Indemnification of Medical Licensees under Price Anderson Act

DATE: November 17, 1'88

Although the Nebraska DOH will not actually participate in the negotiated rulemaking, we would like to make a general statement in support of this effort for Nebraska medical licensees. Nebraska is an Agreement State, therefore, our interest is as a regulatory body. We do not have information on what range of financial protection is currently available to our licensees from commercial sources. However, it is certain that commer 1 vendors of insurance have limited their risk to some amount.

It seems prudent, therefore to have some kind of safety net, i.e. Price Anderson legislation, in place for medical licensees who use radioactive materials. The rationale for this is that miradministrations do occur in the practice of medicine. Although a diagnostir nuclear medicine misadministration is not generally life-threatening, a therapautic misadministration could easily be life threatening - particularly for preients who are already in a weakened condition. Therefore, the Nebraska DOH 'upports the extension of Price Anderson Act to include medical licensees.
