Re: New Hampshire Yankee Beach Sheltering Response

Citizens Within the Ten Mile Radius (C-10) recently obtained a document compiled by New Hampshire Yankee titled "A STUDY TO IDENTIFY POTENTIAL SHELTERS IN THE BEACH AREA NEAR SEABROOK STATION"

The study includes your business property as one of over 350 area buildings listed as "potential shelters" for beachgoers during an accident at Seabrook Station (see partial list attached)

The list, with your name included, was recently submitted to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to support New Hampshire Yankee's claim that adequate shelters exist along the swacoast for all bathers, tourists, residents and employees.

C-10 has determined that few, if any, property owners had been informed of being included on the list prior to C-10 making the list available to the media. Clearly, the utility's sole intent was to convince the NRC that evacuation planning problems could be solved by using your property as a sheltering facility.

Your safety and the safety of the public are at risk. Questions of property owner liability and responsibility have not been addressed. Who will be responsible for the security of your property? Undoubtedly, New Hampshire Yankee had hoped to slide this study through without public scrutiny or property owner agreement.

Unfortunately, unless each business owner emphatically objects to being on the list, it is likely the NRC will assume that each building will be available to support Seabrook's evacuation plan.

Because so many business people want to be removed from the list, we have prepared a statement for your use as notification to the NRC and the Federal Emergency Management Agency. You have not been consulted and that you do not intend to make your property available to New Hampshire Yankee.

We will make additional copies available to attorneys representing seacoast communities at the evacuation plan hearings now underway in Concord, N.H.

It is vital that you give this matter your earliest attention in order to have your statement made part of the Concord hearing record.

Thank you for your cooperation and response. C-10 is pleased to offer this an alternative to becoming part of Seabrook Station's sheltering plan.

It has been brought to my attention that my premises has been listed as a potential public shelter for use in the event of an emergency at Seabrook Station requiring the sheltering of the public in "A STUDY TO IDENTIFY POTENTIAL SHELTERS IN THE BEACH AREA NEAR SEABROOK STATION", prepared by Stone and Webster Engineering Corporation for New Hampshire Yankee (Revision 1, August 1987).

I am writing to make it clear that I was not consulted prior to the inclusion of my premises in the list of potential shelters, and that I do not intend to make my premises available for use as a shelter in the event of an emergency at Seabrook Station.

I request that New Hampshire Yankee remove my premises from any list of potential shelters developed as part of any emergency response plans in connection with New Hampshire Yankee's efforts to obtain an operating license for Seabrook Station from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. I will not permit its use for sheltering purposes.
