

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Diagnostic Services, Inc.

License No. 48-20341-01

As a result of the inspection conducted on May 19, 1988, and in accordance with 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C - General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions (1987), the following violations were identified:

1. License Condition 12 names the physicians that are authorized to use licensed material.

Contrary to the above, physicians not named in License Condition 12 used licensed material. For example, the physicians who routinely used licensed material at Kaukauna Community Hospital, New London Community Hospital, Wild Rose Community Hospital, and Iola Hospital were not authorized as users by the license.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI) and a repeat violation.

2. License Condition 17 states the licensee shall conduct its program in accordance with the statements made in letters dated August 5, 1982 and May 5, 1982. Letters dated August 5, 1982 and May 5, 1982, state inservice training will be held once a year for the nursing and housekeeping staff at the hospitals serviced by Diagnostic Services, Inc.


Contrary to the above, inservice training was not held once a year for the nursing and housekeeping staff at the hospitals serviced by Diagnostic Services, Inc. The last inservice training for the nursing and housekeeping staffs was held on November 11, 1983 at Memorial Hospital (Manitowoc, Wisconsin) and on January 25, 1984 at New London Community Hospital.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, you are required to submit to this office within thirty days of the date of this Notice a written statement or explanation in reply, including for each violation: (1) corrective action taken and the results achieved; (2) corrective action to be taken to avoid further violations; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Consideration may be given to extending your response time for good cause shown.
