SUBJECT: Procedure for Incident \*Com
teporting in the Radiology Department

Radiology incident reporting will follow policy # Admn. 0028. The imployee should complete the form to the best of his/her knowledge, and have it reviewed and signed by his/her immediate supervisor and/or pirector of the Department. To ensure that the incident form is forwarded

the Director of Security and Safety, the employee may assume the esponsibility of the forwarding.

The employee will also record the incident in the Incident Report logbook located in the control area of the department. In the logbook the late of the occurance, patient's name, patient's medical record number, and write description of the incident will be logged. At the end of the month, he Director will review the log and include any marginal occurances in the quality Assessment report. Reports are filed in the Quality Assessment fanual which is accessible to all employees.

If the employee receives no resolution in the aforementioned mechanism, he next step is to notify the Medical Director of the Department or the

(adiation Safety Officer (RSO).

If still no resolution is achieved, the Vice President of Clinical perations and Chief of Surgery should be notified.

## Misadministrations

In the event of a misadministration of radiopharmaceutical or any inusual occurance in the Nuclear Medicine Department, the incident must be reported to three people: the Director of the Department, the RSO and the onsulting physicist. The Director of the Department and the RSO must assume the responsibility of investigating the incident. If a misadministration has occurred, the RSO and Director must (1.) keep records of all disadministrations of radioactive materials, (2.) promptly report therapy misadministrations to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), the referring physician, and the patient or the patient's responsible relative (or uardian), and (3.) report diagnostic misadministrations quarterly to the IRC. The consulting physicist is responsible for expertise in complying to NRC rules and regulations.

The technologist involved with the misadministration must fill out and n incident report and have it forwarded to the Director of Safety and

Security.

If an incident is reported to the RSO and if the RSO decides that it is not reportable to the NRC, then he/she must submit in writing to the Vice resident of Clinical Operations why the incident is not being reported.

If the technologist questions the response of the Director, RSO and/or onsulting physicist, he/she may notify the Vice President of Clinical

Operations and/or the Chief of Surgery.

Any employee, who follows the aforementioned chain of reporting an incident to achieve resolution, will not be fired, retaliated or liscriminated against.
