Sirs:

I want to register my strongest objection to the proposed NRC rule change which would allow licensing of nuclear power plants prior to or in the absence of fully approved evacuation plans submitted by individual states. One must assume that the rule as it currently stands was made for a good reason: to insure local cooperation in the development of evacuation plans that would adequately protect the health and safety of the local populations in areas that could be endangered by accidents at such plants. Clearly, local government is certain to have a very firm grasp on problems that may very easily be overlooked the nudear utility applicants; state government's participation safeguards both local control and the health and safety of the state's population at large and is absolutely essential. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission was wise to stipulate state approval of evacuation plans prior to licensing of new plants in the past; it would however be foolhearty to now try to circumvent state approval in the hope of expediting the opening of new plants when so many lives are at stake.

As a resident of Governor Dummer Academy, the oldest boys' boarding school in the U.S., I have had the opportunity of reading a draft of the evacuation plans submitted for the school by authorities at New Hampshire Yankee in Seabrook and have been appalled by the inaccuracies in the data on this school and by the incredible assumptions that this plan makes: that a school population of ca. 400 can be evacuated by means of the six available school vans (seating a total of 48) and buses which are to be diverted to the school from Boston -- precisely when the same plan stipulates that all evacuation route leading away from Seabrook (and south to Boston) will be one-way; that inaccurate directions to the wrong address of our sister school, the Pingree School in South Hamilton, will enable said bus drivers to deliver students and faculty along winding country roads under crisis conditions to a school which has been designated to temporarily house Governor Dummer students in its dormitories when it has no dormitories; etc. ad absurdum. New Hampshire Yankee has demonstrated its inability to do its homework in the past, and the haste with which it has

submitted "new" evacuation plans to the NRC makes one extremely wary. The fact that evacuation plans proposed by the Seabrook New Hampshire Yankee administration have not been approved by communities within the stipulated ten mile evacuation zone (which, by the way, is pretty stingy in and of itself) has one good explanation: the plans are not viable, nor even remotely realistic, and Seabrook's continuing efforts to gain licensing by any and all means is yet another demonstration of bad faith.

The faculty of Governor Dummer Academy is overwhelmingly opposed to the licensing of the Seabrook plant without approved evacuation plans in place. In door-to-door polling of the parish of Byfield roughly 85-90% of the citizens of this town were of exactly the same opinion and were willing to refinforce that opinion with their signature of petitions on this topic which have since been delivered to the NRC. Since in my mind there is currently no plan available that will guarantee the safe evacuation of my family, friends, and fellow citizens, nor will there ever be, I wish to voice my opposition to this potential rule change. Along with this, I wish to express my fervent hope that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission finally pause long enough to consider its primary responsibility -- to regulate the nuclear industry so as to protect the public's health and safety, not merely rubber-stamp its every wish and whim -- and thus to assure the American citizenry that you will never accept the concept of "acceptable losses" from a nuclear power accident, not now or ever in the future. You were created to protect the public from the dangers of nuclear power, and entrusted with the regulatory power to do so; one can only hope that you will exercise that power wisely.

I am opposed to your proposed rule change which would allow public utilities to submit evacuation plans for communities within the EPZ's of nuclear power plants, when state and local governments refuse to participate in such planning. This proposed rule contradicts President Reagan's position that "this administration does not favor the imposition of federal authority over the objections of state and local governments in matters regarding the adequacy of an emergency evacuation plan for a nuclear power plant." Has the President forgotten this position or does the present NRC board repudiate the Presidents' views? The Federal Amergency Management Agency, FEMA, states clearly that any plans developed without state participation cannot meet their safety standards. Would the commission dismantle FEMA as well? Since Chernobyl, three countries have abandoned nuclear power altogether: Austria, Sweden, and the Philippines, with Greece canceling its first reactor. According to Worldwatch Institute polls, 78% of all Americans oppose any further nuclear power plants. The NRC prefers to dig in its heels and license nuclear power plants at any cost to public health and safety. Perhaps it is time for the resignations of chairman Lando Zech and Mr. Victor Stello for starters. The people will turn to Congress to have their voice heard. I believe we still have a democratic form of government in this country.

Scientist: Emissions may have caused high cancer rates

BOSTON (AP) — A scientist says radioactive releases from the Pilgrim nuclear power plant during the mid-1970s may have lingered in swirling coastal air, causing the high leukemia rates and birth defects documented in five towns near the Plymouth reactor.

A scientific link has not been established between the plant and the high cancer rates, but that possibility should receive serious attention, Dr. Sidney Cobb, an epidemiologist and professor emeritus at Brown University, told a legislative committee yesterday.

Most of the increases in leukemia cases in Plymouth, Duxbury, Scituate, Kingston and Marshfield were seen about five years after a 12-month period from late 1974 through most of 1975 when radioactive emissions from the plant exceeded federal standards "on more than one occasion," Cobb said. The emissions, however, were still under the government's maximum safety level.

He said it would take about five years for residents to suffer leukemia after being exposed to the radioactivity.

Cobb also said infant deaths and congenital birth defects rose in the year following the higher emissions, supporting the theory that radioactivity from the plant caused the health problems.

While saying more detailed studies need to be done, Cobb said there does not appear to be any occupational cause for the health problems in the south shore communities. He also said there is no common water or milk supply that could be the culprit.

Cobb also outlined a theory he said could explain how relatively low levels of radioactive releases could cause leukemia and other health problems.

The scientist said a coastal wind pattern could keep the radiation circulating in the same area, slowly building up over time instead of dissipating.

Cobb also noted that the land rises sharply two to four miles inland, creating a "geographic containing wall" that could confine radiation. And he suggested that coastal fog might be trapping radioactive particles.

An analysis of the leukemia cases by Cobb shows that "essentially ail" of the excess cases are clustered within a four-mile wide strip of the coast, extending 20 miles along the shore. He called it a "very narrow, very unususal geographic distribution for leukemia."

Cobb said there is a similar leukemia-rate increase in the coastal area near the Maine Yankee plant in Wiscasset, Maine.

Higher cancer rates found in towns near Pilgrim plant

BOSTON — A new study by the state Department of Public Health has found a significantly higher rate of leukemia in males living in a five-town area around the Pilgrim nuclear power plant in Plymouth.

Cancer rates among females living in the study area of Plymouth, Kingston, Marshfield, Scituate and Duxbery were also higher than expected, but state officials say those increases are not "statistically significant."

But the findings do not lay the blame for elevated cancer rates at the nuclear facility's doorstep. A state epidemiologist who reviewed the findings yesterday said the leukemia could be the result of radiation, benezene or even pesticides.

"We weren't able to determine what is causing it," said Robert Knorr, chief of the state epidemiology unit. "We can't say what is causing the excess, only that the excess is there."

In the five towns combined, Knorr said that between 1982 and 66

1984 the state found 31 cancers were reported in males. Given the age and size of the population, Knorr said the state expected just 18 cases.

In females for the same years, the state recorded 21 cancers against an expected rate of 15 cancers. While that number is higher than the expectation, Knorr said it is not "significant" enough to cause alarm.

In all categories of cancers analyzed by state health officials, males were found to have higher rates in the five towns than were anticipated.

Knorr said it is impossible to assess the cause of the cancer without a clearly defined health study of area residents. He said the department would have to do extensive interviews of 300 carefully selected residents within the area to determine key facts such as lenght of residency; possible exposure to chemicals at the workplace and other occupation hazards; and possible exposure to drugs that may have similar effects.

That study has not been authorized by the Legislature nor sought by the department as of yet.

Department spokesman John Stobierski said it is not for the department to say what the response to the data will be. "We're gathering data and say what we can draw from that as a result of the evidence. After that isn't our call to make."



32,000 signatures collected on anti-nuclear petition

AMESBURY — The anti-nuclear petition drive launched throughout the region two weeks ago has gathered twice as many signatures as expected, says the head of the group sponsoring the drive.

Thomas Moughan, director of the Amesbury-based group Citizens Within the 10-Mile Radius, said 32,000 residents of the 37 communities along the coast between Gloucester and Portsmouth, N.H., had signed the petition.

He said he and at least 30 other participants in the petition drive will hand-deliver copies of the petition to federal regulators, the White House and Congressional leaders in Washington, D.C., on April 2.

The petition, directed at the Nu-

clear Regulatory Commission, opposes relaxing emergency evacuation planning requirments for the Seabrook nuclear power plant. The petition also calls for an investigation into the safety of the plant.

"We had hoped to gather 15,000 names," said Moughan. "But the interest in the petition expanded beyond the original 10-mile radius. The response was overwhelming."

He said 1,000 of the signatures were on flyers left on doorsteps, filled out by residents and mailed to Citizens Within the 10-Mile Radius.

The group gathered 4,500 signatures each in Amesbury and Newburyport, 3,500 on Cape Ann, 1,800 in Ipswich, 1,000 each in Salisbury

and West Newbury, 1,600 in Newbury and 600 in Merrimack, said Moughan.

He said in Exeter, N.H., where police twice broke up petition efforts, 2,500 signatures were gathered.

"Now, we're setting to the job of recopying and collating 1,800 sheets with signatures," said Moughan. "We wanted to make 25 complete sets. But that would require 84 reams of copy paper."

Moughan said copies of the petition will be delivered to members of the NRC, New England congressional delegates, President Ronald Reagan, Gov. Michael Dukakis of Massachusetts, Gov. John Sununu of New Hampshire and all declared presidential candidates.

Group to review health data concerning Three Mile Island

NEWBURYPORT — Health data from Pennsylvania's Three Mile Island area is the primary topic to be discussed during a regular meeting of Citizens Within the Ten Mile Radius this evening.

Chris Nord of Merrimac will present the results of a research project conducted by residents of the Three Mile Island area which he said plots high incidences of cancer, leukemias and other negative health effects along the pathways of radioactive plumes released during the 1979 accident.

The meeting, which is open to the public, will be held at St. Paul's Church, High and Market streets, at 7:30 p.m.

Also on the agenda is a report from the 10-mile citizens group coordinator Thomas Moughan and Norma Beit about their attendance last month at a Nuclear Regulatory Commission hearing on a draft proposal to limit state and local participation in evacuation planning. The NRC voted after the hearing to accept the proposal for consideration.

A report will also be given on the results of the petition drive, conducted by the group in late February, concerning Seabrook Station's bid to reduce the emergency planning zone from 10 miles to one. The petition drive, which lasted one week, gathered thousands of signatures from Cape Ann to Portsmouth, N.H.

Group members will discuss plans to deliver the petitions in person to Washington, to members of Congress as well as

There won't be a home to go home to

In 1945, prior to the bombing of Japan, the U.S. detonated atomic Bombs on the Island of Bikini. The inhabitants were "temporarily" relocated in order to accommodate the test bombings. Now, forty years later, those displaced citizens are still unable to go home; the island is still rendered uninhabitable

In April, 1986, the nuclear accident at Chernobyl was reported to be five times as powerful as were the

bombs dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

A Swedish exchange student residing with us for the current school year bears the effects of his country's proximity to Chernobyl (nearly one thousand miles away) by having a body count measurably higher in radioactivity. Further, there is news from his uncle, a sportsman, who shot some game and then had to bury the kill because of its contamination. Moreover, there is word from his cousin in the north of Sweden about the mass destruction of entire reindeer herds across all of Scandinavia threatening an end to a way of life for a segment of the

population.

We teach our children that we learn from our mistakes while we live with the bromide that "history repeats itself." Perhaps there is more truth to Arnold Toynbee's spiral theory than meets the eye. Only just maybe each recurring mistake may be ultimately worse than the one which precedes it like the threads on a screw — spiraling in an ever narrowing circuitous route downward. Why else would we permit a situation like Seabrook to continue? We have been led to believe "it can't happen here." We are "too advanced in our technology" and we are reminded that "Seabrook Station is fool-proof." Despite documented substance abuse by construction workers, despite the long delays and exposure of the carbon steel parts to weather and corrosive salt and despite the demonstrated malfunc-

tioning of valves, we have been assured that there is virtually no possible danger of an accident. (So safe, in fact, that those businesses in the immediate area cannot get insurance coverage.) Nevertheless, the powers that be have promised an absolute when logic tells us there can be NO absolute. The construction, the operation and the ongoing maintenance of Seabrook Station is subject to human error. Accidents are, by their very nature, unpredictable; can we be so smug to assume Americans don't make mistakes! To have allowed the construction of Seabrook Station on a corrosive, unstable, salt marsh, with its fragile eco-system, is unconscionable. To grant a license to operate such a plant is negligent and grossly irresponsible. And, as if the aforementioned were not enough, the public is being subjected to endless, infuriating media attempts, by the Coalition for Reliable Energy, to cram a white elephant down our collective throats and stifle the public outcries. By the wisdom of the powers that be, they can cut the states out of the decision making with regard to nuclear power plants and decrease the emergency evacuation zone to ground zero. Disregard the potential threat of a nuclear accident because, in the event of a real disaster, we may find our homes and cities from Portland to Boston and beyond uninhabitable for years, our lifetime perhaps. We won't need your electricity then. Further, barring any untoward circumstance, twenty years from now when Seabrook has become obsolete, it will simply be sealed up like a nuclear time capsule — to sit silenced atop the salt marshes. Eventually the legacy to our progeny will be their very own Love Canal.

Is this twentieth century Da-Mock-Racy where money talks and the voice of the people be damned?

Commissioners:

I strongly object to the NRC proposed rule change that attempts to undermind State and Governor's authority in the emergency planning process for nuclear reactors. In addition, I submit for public comment the signitures of 250 area residents who also oppose the proposed rule change.

It is well within the role of a state Governor to have jurisdiction over matters such as emergency planning that will directly affect the health and safety of the residents of his or her state. NRC critique said leaked to plant owner

Wash 'ngton Post WASHINGTON - Nuclear Regulatory Commission documents.alleging serious safety defects at a Louisiana nuclear-power plant were leaked to the plant's owner. apparently from the office of an NRC commissioner who later tried to destroy evidence of the security breach, the agency's chief inspector has told Congress.

Ben B. Hayes, head of the NRC Office of Investigations, told the Senate Governmental Affairs Committee Thursday that the documents, dated June 8, 1983, gave the Louisiana Power & Light Co. a 'tremendous advantage in a subsequent safety investigation at its Waterford nuclear plant near New Orleans.

He and other witnesses said the leak to LP&L appeared to be part of a pattern of NRC coziness with the nuclear-power industry. to the point of squeiching potentially embarrassing investigations and compromising safety.

The document leak was not discovered until 1985 and was never fully investigated, Hayes said. He testified that he was ordered to turn over his notes and all copies of the documents to NRC Commissioner Thomas M. Roberts, who told the senators he destroyed them.

The documents outlined information gathered by a reporter about cracks in the concrete floor of Waterford's containment facility and unspecified "collusion" between the NRC and utility officials to cover up the problem.



NRC critique said leaked to plant owner

WASHINGTON - Nuclear Regulatory Commission documents alleging serious safety defects at a Louisiana nuclear-power plant were leaked to the plant's owner, apparently from the office of an NRC commissioner who later tried to destroy evidence of the security breach, the agency's chief inspector has told Congress.

Ben B. Hayes, head of the NBC Office of Investigations, told the Senate Governmental Affairs Committee Thursday that the documents, dated June 8, 1983, gave the Louisiana Power & Light Co. a "tremendous advantage"—In a subsequent safety investigation at its Waterford nuclear plant near New Orleans.

He and other witnesses said the leak to LP&L appeared to be part of a pattern of NRC coziness with the nuclear-power industry, to the point of squelching potentially embarrassing investigations and compromising safety.

The document leak was not discovered until 1985 and was never fully investigated, Hayes said. He testified that he was ordered to turn over his notes and all copies of the documents to NRC Commissioner Thomas M. Roberts, who told the senators he destroyed them.

The documents outlined information gathered by a reporter about cracks in the concrete floor of Waterford's containment facility and unspecified "collusion" between the NRC and utility officials to cover up the problem.

Ben B. Hayes, head of the NRC Office of Investigations, told the Senate Governmenta! Affairs Committee Thursday that the documents, dated June 8, 1983, gave the Louisiana Power & Light Co. a 'tremendous advantage" In a subsequent safety investigation at its Waterford nuclear plant near New Orleans.

He and other witnesses said the leak to LP&L appeared to be part of a pattern of NRC coziness with the nuclear-power industry. to the point of squelching potentially embarrassing investigations and compromising safety.

The document leak was not discovered until 1985 and was never fully investigated. Hayes said. He testified that he was ordered to turn over his notes and all copies of the documents to NRC Commissioner Thomas M. Roberts, who told the senators he destroyed them.

The documents outlined information gathered by a reporter about cracks in the concrete floor of Waterford's containment facility and unspecified "collusion" between the NRC and utility officials

to cover up the problem.

NRC critique said leaked to plant owner

WASHINGTON - Nuclear Regulatory Commission documents alleging serious safety defects at a Louisiana nuclear-power plant were leaked to the plant's owner, apparently from the office of an NRC commissioner who later tried to destroy evidence of the security breach, the agency's chief inspector has told Congress.

Ben B. Hayes, head of the NRC Office of investigations, told the Senate Governmental Affair's Committee Thursday that the documents, dated June 8, 1983, gave the Louisiana Power & Light Cp. a "tremendous advantage" in a subsequent safety investigation at its Waterford nuclear plant near New Orleans.

He and other witnesses said the leak to LP&L appeared to be part of a pattern of NRC coziness with the nuclear-power industry, to the point of squeiching potentially embarrassing investigations and compromising safety.

The document leak was not discovered until 1985 and was never fully investigated, Hayes said. He testified that he was ordered to turn over his notes and all copies of the documents to NRC Commissioner Thomas M. Roberts, who told the senators he destroyed them.

The documents outlined information gathered by a reporter about cracks in the concrete floor of Waterford's containment facility and unspecified "collusion" between the NRC and utility officials to cover up the problem.

NRC critique said leaked to plant owner

WASHINGTON - Nuclear Regulatory Commission documents alleging serious safety defects at a Louisiana nuclear-power plant were leaked to the plant's owner, apparently from the office of an NRC commissioner who later tried to destroy evidence of the security breach, the agency's chief inspector has told Congress.

Ben B. Hayes, head of the NBC Office of Investigations, told the Senate Governmental Affairs Committee Thursday that the documents, dated June 8, 1983, gave the Louisiana Power & Light Co. a "tremendous advantage"—In a subsequent safety investigation at its Waterford nuclear plant near New Orleans.

He and other witnesses said the leak to LP&L appeared to be part of a pattern of NRC coziness with the nuclear-power industry, to the point of squelching potentially embarrassing investigations and compromising safety.

The document leak was not discovered until 1985 and was never fully investigated, Hayes said. He testified that he was ordered to turn over his notes and all copies of the documents to NRC Commissioner Thomas M. Roberts, who told the senators he destroyed them.

The documents outlined information gathered by a reporter about cracks in the concrete floor of Waterford's containment facility and unspecified "collusion" between the NRC and utility officials to cover up the problem.

NRC critique said leaked to plant owner

WASHINGTON - Nuclear Regulatory Commission documents.alleging serious safety defects at a Louisiana nuclear-power plant were leaked to the plant's owner. apparently from the office of an NRC commissioner who later tried to destroy evidence of the security breach, the agency's chief inspector has told Congress.

Ben B. Hayes, head of the NRC Office of Investigations, told the Senate Governmental Affairs Committee Thursday that the documents, dated June 8, 1983, gave the Louisiana Power & Light Co, a "tremendous advantage"-In a subsequent safety investigation at its Waterford nuclear plant near New Orleans.

He and other witnesses said the leak to LP&L appeared to be part of a pattern of NRC coziness with the nuclear-power industry, to the point of squelching potentially embarrassing investigations and compromising safety.

The document leak was not discovered until 1985 and was never fully investigated, Hayes said. He testified that he was ordered to turn over his notes and all copies of the documents to NRC Commissioner Thomas M. Roberts, who told the senators he destroyed them.

The documents outlined information gathered by a reporter about cracks in the concrete floor of Waterford's containment facility and unspecified "collusion" between the NRC and utility officials

to cover up the problem.

Concerning what promises to be the most ludicrous proposal that NRC has ever sought to undertake, the thoughts I have about NRC at this time can be characterized as ones of shock, dismay, anger and a sense that something must be done by Congress to change the promotional bent of the Commission over the last few years.

Totally rejecting its mandate to consider the health and welfare of people residing near a nuclear plant, NRC at this time seeks to license over massive objection two of the most controversial and ill-sited plants ever conceived, surpassing only because of the population density and evacuation considerations the siting of the three-unit complex nearby us on Artificial Island (Salem I & II and Hope Creek I) that is founded on bottomless sands and muck that will liquify under severe earthquake situations.

Rejecting the many valid arguments posed by citizens and elected officials alike, NRC has decided to license Seabrook and Shorham at any cost - preferring the financial considerations of the utilities as they trample on the civil liberties of a vast number of concerned citizens in several states.


