By this letter, Houston Lighting and Power Company (HL&P) submits Revision 3 of the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station (STPEGS) Emergency Plan. This revision of the Emergency Plan incorporates resolutions to comments provided by the NRC staff reviewer on April 9, 1987. In addition, editorial corrections have been made as identified in the attached summary of Revision 3. This revision is provided in the form of replacement pages. Corresponding outdated pages should be removed and destroyed. Revision 3 has been reviewed by the STPEGS Plant Operations Review Committee.

The following is provided in response to specific information requested by the NRC:

- 1) The STPEGS Prompt Notification System consists of sirens and Tone Alert Radios. The sirens are installed and operational, and the distribution of Tone Alert Radios is expected to begin on May 11, 1987 and continue until completion, which is anticipated to be no later than June 5, 1987. Priority will be given to distributing the radios to persons outside of the siren range first to ensure that the population within the 10 mile radius is covered by at least one means of notification prior to Fuel Load in Unit 1. With the completion of the distribution of the Tone Alert Radios, the STPEGS Prompt Notification System will be complete and operational.
- 2) Information and Procedures contained in the State of Texas Emergency Plan provide for Medical Services as described in guidance memo, FEMA-MS-1. As a commitment to FEMA by the State of Texas, letters of agreement with the medical facilities described in their plan are in the process of being obtained.
