Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, et seq., the New England Coalition on Nuclear Pollution ("NECNP") requests that you make the following documents available in the NRC's Public Document Room in Washington, D.C.:

1) All notes, memoranda, or other documents that evaluate or discuss a letter (and/or its attachments) from John DeVincentis of Public Service of New Hampshire to Vincent S. Noonan, NRC, dated July 21, 1986. A copy of the letter is attached.

2) All notes, memoranda, or other documents that evaluate or discuss a letter (and/or its attachments) from John DeVincentis of Public Service of New Hampshire to Vincent S. Noonan, NRC, dated July 29, 1986. A copy of the letter is attached.

3) All notes, memoranda, or other documents which discuss in any respect the size of the Seabrook emergency planning zone, and/or possible changes to the size of the EPZ. This request does not include documents that have been served on the parties to the Seabrook operating license proceeding.

4) All calculations in the Commission's possession regarding the strength of the containment at the Seabrook nuclear power plant.

5) All memoranda or notes, including handwritten notes, of meetings or telephone conversations regarding revisions or proposed revisions to the Seabrook probabilistic risk assessment.


6) All memoranda or notes, including handwritten notes, of meetings or telephone conversations regarding possible changes to the size of the Seabrook emergency planning zone.

7) All documents regarding steam explosions not already provided in response to Sholly FOIA 85-448.

NECNP is an intervenor in the Seabrook operating license proceeding. The organization intends to use this information in the licensing hearings to further the public's interest in the safety of operation of the Seabrook plant. Therefore we request that you waive any copying and search fees pursuant to 10 C.F.R. 9.14(c).
