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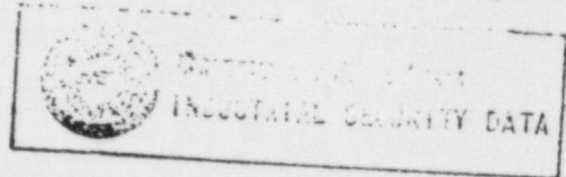

Dear Mr. Keppler:

An investigator employed by Pinkerton's, Inc. was assigned as a security guard at Quad-Cities Nuclear Power Station from March 21 through April 7, 1977. The purpose of assigning the investigator was to determine if allegations by Mr. James E. McKay, a Pinkerton Guard, were credible.

Based on a recommendation by the investigator, Mr. McKay was offered another position by Pinkerton's Inc. and transferred from the station. According to the investigator's reports, Mr. McKay was disliked by all of the station guards and by many of the Commonwealth Edison Company employees at the station. It was the investigator's opinion that Mr. McKay was "a troublemaker and highly over-reactive and imaginative".

The enclosure to the March 10 letter to Mr. Keppler included seven items which were to receive emphasis during the investigation. The following paragraphs are keyed by number to the paragraph of the March 10 report and include the findings of the investigator:

2. The metal detector did not always work properly because it required sensitivity adjustments to detect keys and other small metal objects. Appropriate adjustments are made as necessary and adjustment controls are secured by a lock. Access to the adjustment controls is permitted by the shift supervisor.



8. Each time an employee attempted to exit the Protected Area with Company property without appropriate authorization, the employee was required to return to the plant for a property pass.
11. The guard filing cabinet was left unlocked at times, but only for several minutes and only if a guard was near by. When the cabinet was not locked after use by a guard, it was brought to the guards attention by a guard sergeant.
17. The guard test was found to be well written, difficult and thorough. The investigator suggested some improvements for instructors which are being evaluated by Pinkerton's, Inc. The test is designed to cover the basic guard training, but not all specific station security procedures.
23. The investigator was unable to identify any guard at the station who has attempted to sell stolen materials.
24. The investigator did not observe any employee depart without turning-in his security badge. There have been no reports of badges taken from the Protected Area since March 10, 1977, when the guards were requested to include such occurrences in the guard report.
28. The investigator identified no basis for questioning any guard's integrity because of a large purchase.

Item 21 of the enclosure to the March 10 letter included a statement that station management was evaluating the use of local audible alarms on the [REDACTED] Vital Area Doors. The alarms were installed and are providing adequate assurance that the doors are properly closed.

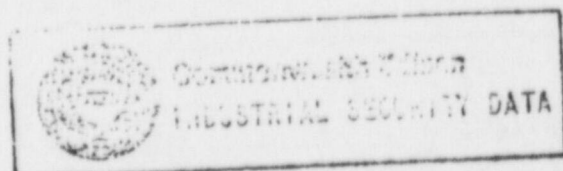

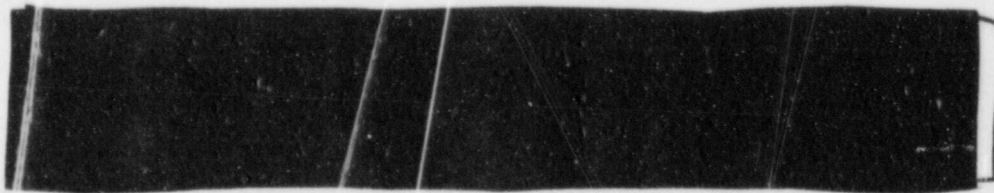

Subject: Report of Investigation of Allegations by
Quad-Cities Nuclear Power Station Guards
James E. McKay

During the period March 2 through March 8, 1977, an investigation concerning allegations by Mr. McKay was conducted by the following individuals:



Each of the following paragraphs includes a statement of the allegation; a summary of findings; and, if appropriate, corrective action taken:

1. Papers (drawings and unidentified specifications) were found near the Protected Area fence.

The papers were provided by Mr. McKay and examined. The papers pertain to contractual arrangements, work orders, construction requests and accounting statements. All of the papers are in excess of five years old and were disposed of following a recent purge of files. None of the papers contains information of significance to the security program. No drawings were included with the papers provided by Mr. McKay.

2. The metal detector does not always work properly. Some of the guards have walked through without detection while carrying a weapon.

The metal detector was checked and found to be operating properly. The sensitivity of the metal detector is set to detect [redacted] grams of ferrous metal. In a telephone conversation with Mr. McKay on March 3, he explained that the ability of the guards to defeat the metal detector was as a result of repeated efforts and experimentation. Since personnel normally entering the Protected Area are not provided with the opportunity to experiment with the metal detector, this is not considered to be a security weakness. A report of investigation by Pinkerton's, Inc. will include an evaluation of the ability of the guards to defeat the metal detector.

3. The Radiation Portal Monitor is not always working properly.

Two Radiation Portal Monitors are located in the guardhouse. The monitors facilitate rapid egress from the site since the monitors nominally require ten seconds to complete a cycle. Also, some redundancy is provided in the case of a failed component. The monitors have experienced some failures, but not normally both at the same time. If both monitors fail, a Geiger-Mueller counter is available at all times at the guardhouse for radiation check-out purposes. Radiation Chemistry Technicians are on site at all times and are to be called if the monitors fail. During the day shift Monday through Friday, instrument mechanics are available to service the monitors. The NRC recently investigated allegations concerning defective portal monitors and found no evidence of noncompliance.

4. A Commonwealth Edison employe named [REDACTED] talks disrespectfully about other employes around the guards.

Mr. [REDACTED] does have somewhat of an out-going personality, however this has no security implications.

5. Employes have been observed intentionally abusing dosimeters by throwing them against the window shade and floor of the guardhouse.

A Radiation Chemistry Technician acknowledged such abuse to be of a jovial nature after determining a dosimeter to be inoperative and of no possible further use. The purpose of the abuse was to render the dosimeters "obviously inoperable" so they could not be inadvertently reused.

Corrective Action: The employe has been instructed to discontinue the practice of throwing dosimeters and an alternate method to insure that the dosimeters will not be inadvertently reused has been suggested.

6. Unauthorized contractors have been observed in Vital Areas. No positive action was taken when this was reported.

In accordance with the Security Plan and Procedures, contractors are permitted unescorted access to Vital Areas as required in the performance of their duties. There have been no reports of unauthorized contractor personnel in Vital Areas.

7. A Vital Area door was reported broken and unlocked for several days before a guard was posted.

At 4:00 p.m. on January 27, a Vital Area door was reported damaged. The door, even though damaged, could still be locked. By January 29, the door had not been repaired and had become practically inoperable. Guards were instructed to check the door twice per shift to insure that it was locked. A guard was posted at the door on January 31 and February 1 while the door was being repaired.

8. Rolls of steel, scrap copper and sandpaper have been taken by employees without property passes.

It is suspected that theft of station property by employees and contractors does occur. Theft of small quantities of material is extremely difficult to detect. Presently, no information is available which indicates that any specific employee or contractor is guilty of theft of station property. An investigation by Pinkerton's, Inc. will include an effort to determine if the station guards are knowledgeable of unreported thefts.

9. Employees frequently depart without turning in security badges.

Occasionally an employee will depart the station and inadvertently fail to turn in this security badge. Employees must return security badges to the guardhouse in order to reenter the Protected Area. This is not considered to be a frequent occurrence.

Corrective Action: In order to determine frequency, guards have been instructed to include reports in the daily guard log of employees departing without turning in security badges.

10. A guard [REDACTED] had the guard force Vital Area keys at home for 2 or 3 days.

The keys, which were Protected Area gate keys rather than Vital Area door keys, were reported missing and assumed to be lost. The gate locks were exchanged for new locks and new keys were issued. After the locks were changed it was discovered that a guard, who had been on a weekend break, had inadvertently taken the missing keys home with him.

11. Contrary to security procedures, the guard file cabinet is always unlocked.

Quad-Cities security procedures do not require that the guard filing cabinet in the guardhouse be locked. This requirement is included in a written procedure for the guards issued by Pinkerton, Inc. An investigation by Pinkerton's, Inc. will include an effort to determine if the filing cabinet is normally unlocked.

12. Employees and contractors are frequently observed in hard hat areas without hard hats.

Enforcement of the OSHA hard hat requirement has at times been difficult, particularly with contractor personnel, however, it does not present a security problem. Recent progress has been made with both station and construction personnel since increased emphasis has been placed on wearing hard hats. Contract specifications contain a statement referencing the hard hat requirement and its implementation.

13. Floor plans of the plant from the guard procedure are missing.

The exact nature of the drawings which may be missing from the guard procedure cannot be determined. At some time in the past, drawings may have been available to the guards which showed the Protected Area, perimeter and gate numbers, or engineering drawings which showed the plant floor plan. Drawings of this type have been widely distributed and if such drawings are missing from the guard procedure, the loss of the drawings does not have a significant adverse affect on the station security program. A set of engineering drawings showing the plant floor plan were located in a desk drawer in the guardhouse.

14. An employe named [REDACTED] frequently drives at a dangerously high rate of speed within the Protected Area.

No information pertaining to speeding within the Protected Area is available; however, Mr. [REDACTED] has been instructed to insure that he does not exceed safe speeds while operating a vehicle within the Protected Area.

15. Engineering drawings were found in an unoccupied, unsecured area.

Engineering drawings of a non-security nature are abundant in administrative areas which at certain times are unoccupied and unsecured. This does not violate the station security plan, nor does it present a security problem.

16. CCTV cameras are frequently inoperative because of weather or because they require maintenance.

At times CCTV cameras are inoperative because of weather or maintenance requirements. Inoperative remote visual monitoring equipment providing surveillance capabilities for the Protected Area is documented by guard reports. When [REDACTED] are conducted in accordance with the Security Plan.

17. The qualification test for the guards does not agree with written procedures.

A review of the guard qualification did not reveal areas which are not in agreement with written procedures. This item will receive further evaluation in an investigation by Pinkerton's, Inc.

18. A lot of fish are killed.

Fish impingement is monitored at the station pursuant to the station's Technical Specifications. Technical Specification Appendix B.2.3.A requires that an inventory of fish entrapment on the intake structure be made twice per week. This information is reported to the NRC in a semi-annual report, "Operation Environmental Monitoring in the Mississippi River near Quad-Cities Station" by Nalco Environmental Sciences. Additionally, the information is reported to the Illinois and Federal Environmental Protection Agencies as a requirement of the Station's NPDES permit.

19. A vehicle was not provided for required guard patrols in extremely cold weather.

Guard patrols are conducted in accordance with the Security Plan and Procedures regardless of the weather conditions. Approximately three months ago an electric car purchased for use by the security force was returned to the vendor for repair. The car was experimental in nature and the malfunction could not be diagnosed on site. The vendor did not progress in the repair of the vehicle, therefore it was retrieved during the week of February 28 through March 4 and repairs are to be undertaken by Commonwealth Edison.

20. The Owner Controlled Area gate # 28 is broken.

Gate # 28, an Owner Controlled Area gate, which is not in the Protected Area barrier, was damaged. A work request to repair the damage was submitted on November 19, 1976 and resubmittal on January 12 and January 26, 1977. The gate is scheduled for repair on March 9.

21. Vital Area doors are frequently found intentionally left open.

A Vital Area door intentionally left open is not considered to be a frequent occurrence. Vital Area doors to the [REDACTED] an area isolated from the main building which has a relatively high number of personnel entering and exiting, are the primary problem area. These doors are checked [REDACTED] times daily by the Station Security Officer and [REDACTED] times per shift by the station security guards. A security education program places emphasis on security by station management at weekly department meetings.

Corrective Action: Station management is evaluating the use of local audible alarms for installation on the [REDACTED] Vital Area doors. These alarms would insure personnel awareness of a door which was not properly closed.

22. Doors to the administrative areas are frequently left unsecured.

There is not a security requirement to lock the administrative area doors. The unlocked administrative areas are not Vital Areas.

23. A Pinkerton guard offered to sell stolen motor oil.

No additional information is available concerning sale of stolen property by guards. An investigation by Pinkerton's, Inc. will include an effort to determine if members of the guard force are dealing in stolen property.

24. Employees do not always check-out and check-in for lunch.

The number of employees departing the station at lunch is quite small since only 30 minutes is allowed; therefore, there is no reason to believe that employees slip out unaccounted for. It is the practice of some guards not to file the security badges for the employees departing for lunch in their respective slots since they return after a very short period of time. This item will, however, be included in the investigation by Pinkerton's, Inc.

25. The electric car for the guards was abused and has not been returned for the use of the guards.

The cause of malfunction in the electric car has not been determined. The status of repairs to the car is provided by Item 19.

26. Badge photos: some were expired and not replaced; one guard was photographed in civilian clothes.

The Station Security Office maintains an effective suspense and notification system for insuring that badges are reissued prior to expiration dates. A monthly list of badges which will expire is provided to the guards. The guards verbally notify employees of expiration and if necessary attach notes to the badges. If a badge is not renewed prior to the expiration date it is removed from the badge rack and provided to the Station Security Officer. At times a guard photograph on a security badge may be made with the guard dressed in civilian clothes. This lack of uniformity in badge photographs for guards has not adversely affected station security, however, in the future guard photographs for badges will be taken with the guard wearing a uniform.

27. When Mr. [REDACTED] visited the station the guards were jokingly making comments that someone should shoot him.

Mr. [REDACTED] has not visited the station recently. These comments may have been made during a recent visit by an Executive Vice President of the Company. Comments of this nature are not condoned, however, we do not believe that a threat exists to the individual or to the security of the station as a result of the comments.

28. One of the guards has recently purchased a new car and a house.

This allegation implies that a guard obtained the money necessary for these purchases through some sort of illegal activity. No information which substantiates illegal activity by members of the guard force is available. However, the investigation by Pinkerton's, Inc. will include an effort to determine if guards are involved in illegal activity.

Mr. [REDACTED] fired me for allegedly releasing confidential information on a Cordova, Ill nuclear plant (CECO) to outside persons who were not Pinkerton employees. Mr. [REDACTED] accused me of fabricating lies, ~~and~~ and false accusations about matters dealing with the nuclear plant security system. Mr. [REDACTED] would not or could not reveal the specific details or persons I was to have contacted outside the Pinkerton Company. More will be said on this later.

During my employment with Pinkerton's, Inc. as a nuclear security guard I had discovered some, possibly many, discrepancies of a security nature in the months ^{DECEMBER} Jan, Feb and March of 1977 at the Quad City Cordova Nuclear Plant (CECO). On a number of occasions I ~~reported~~ ^{reported} these discrepancies to a Lt. Jim Snow, my boss. Mr. [REDACTED] informed me to leave well enough alone, and to keep my G.D. mouth shut. I then made a number of phone attempts to get in touch

with Lt. [redacted] boss, Mr. [redacted]
Mys. of the Rock Island office. on
many calls to Mr. [redacted] office I was
informed he was too busy or not in, or
he could not be disturbed. Then they
would refer me to Lt. [redacted] 2nd
in command. This ~~continued~~ ended at a
dead end. I would not talk with

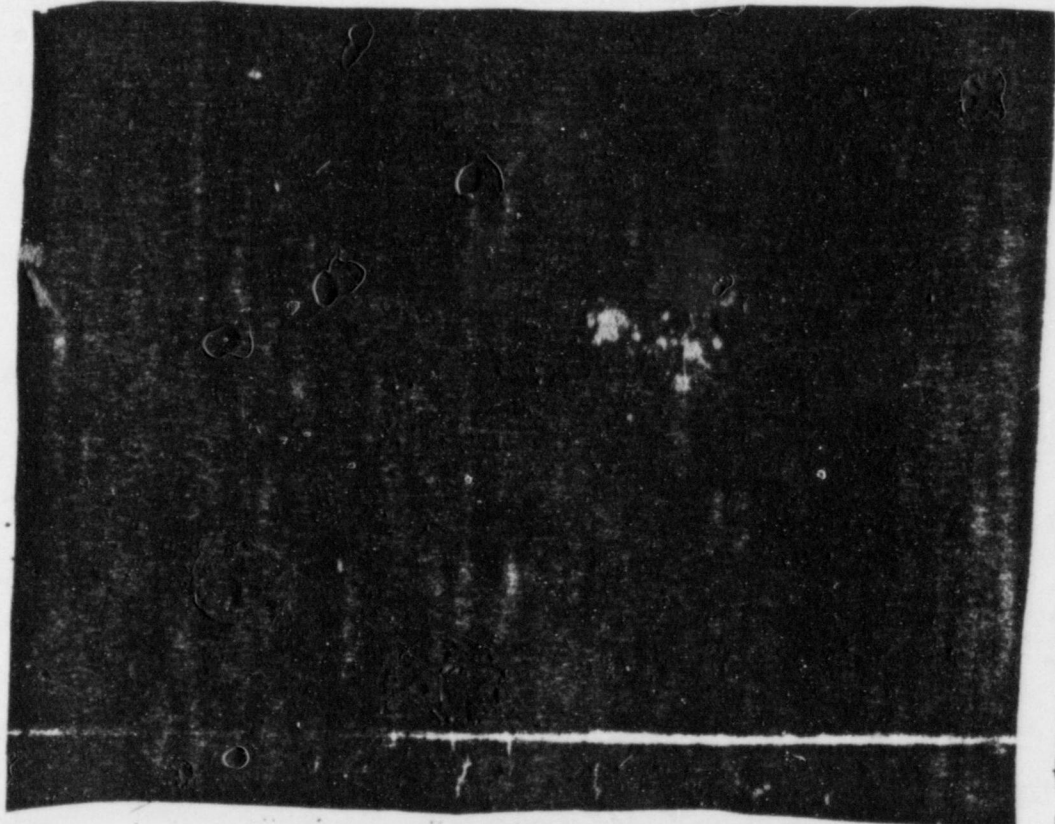

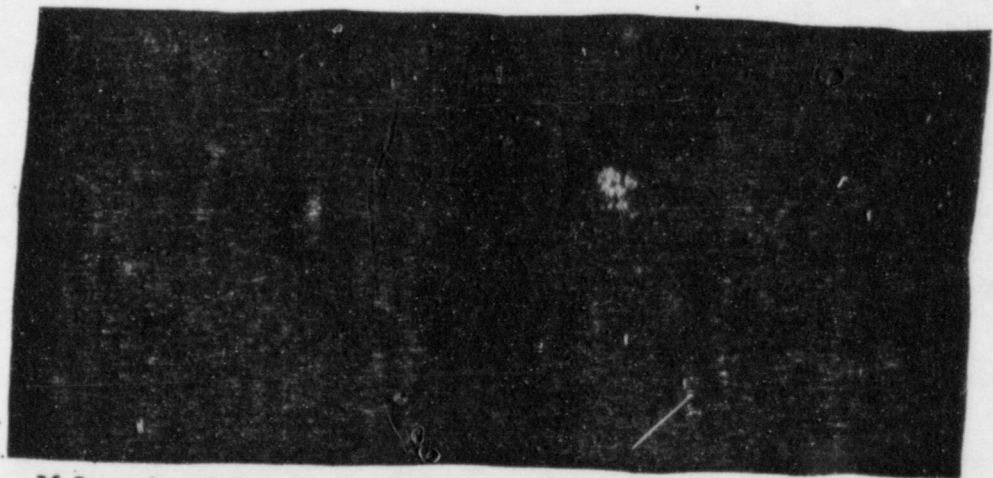
