

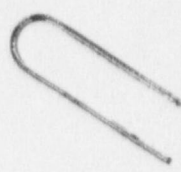

Dear Sir:

On January 15, 1958, we were notified by the Nucleonic Corporation of America that our film badge #4 showed an exposure of 2.3r for the week of December 30, 1957 - January 4, 1958. This film badge number is assigned to one of our employees, Mr. [REDACTED]

During this period, Mr. [REDACTED] was on vacation from December 30th until January 2nd. Mr. [REDACTED] did not wear a new film badge during this week, using instead a film badge that was assigned him the previous week. During the period of time involved, Mr. [REDACTED] film badge that is in question was stored in a refrigerator along with all unused film badges and the control badge.

We are definitely certain that no one used film badge #4 during the period in question. Since there are sufficient spare badges available for all personnel as well as for a considerable number of outside visitors, it is not a practice at Nuclear Systems to use badges assigned to one individual for any reason no matter what the reason.

Therefore, we can only assume that something has happened to the film for this particular badge and can in no way substantiate any incident or condition that might have affected it.
