There are many reasons why I oppose the Montague Nuclear Power Station. I shall dwell briefly on one.

A byproduct of the power plant will be plutonium. The substance could be used for making nuclear explosives. But even more important is the fact that the inhalation of a particle of plutonium can cause cancer. A pound of plutonium, spread around the country, could make cancer victims of all of us.

Plant overseers will be careful, of course. But already plutonium has escaped. And in the case of this substance, its potential for harm lasts for generations.

In the light of such grave dangers, it seems irresponsible, criminal to go ahead with nuclear power plants.

Can't we find less hazardous methods of producing power? Or do with less?
