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BODEGA BAY

WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission has given its approval for the construction of an atomic power plant by the Pacific Gas ar' Electric Company on Bodega Head, and
WHEREAS, Bodega Head has been considered a prime area for the University of California Marine Biological Station and the Bodega Bay area has been recommended as a State Park as early as 1956, and
WHEREAS, the presence of the PG&E atomic facility on Bodega Head will diminish or destroy the worth of the biological station as well as remove the proposed State Park area from the public domain, and
WHEREAS, it is further alleged that the presence of the atomic reactor at Bodega Head because of its proximity to the San Andreas fault creates a potential health hazard for the people of Northern California,
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the California Democratic Council urge the Public Utilities Commission to grant a pending petition for a rehearing of this matter.

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
