Petition Charges

Violation

1/15/63

A petition was filed with the Public Utilities Commission claiming that the Pacific Gas & Electric Co. is going ahead with construction of the 325,000-kilowatt atomic power plant at Bodega Bay in violation of the PUC permit issued last November.

David Pesonen of Berkeley, secretary of the 1,000-member Northern California Association to Preserve Bodega Head and Harbor, commended PG & E broke ground for construction of the atomic plant last week without complying with the commission's order. The petition alleges that the company's permit to start construction is not final until approval to construct the plant has been obtained from the Atomic Energy Commission. The surveys of the marine environment have shown that the operation of the plant would not be adverse to the public interest.

The association, with members throughout the Bay Area and Sonoma County, has opposed the reactor plant at Bodega Bay.

Tony's petition urged the PUC to exercise its powers of injunction to halt the initial ground-breaking begun last week by the company's contractor.

The AEC announced earlier this month that "in view of the public interest in the proposed reactor, the commission has decided hearings will be held in California."

The date and location of the hearings, usually held at Germantown, Md., have not been announced.

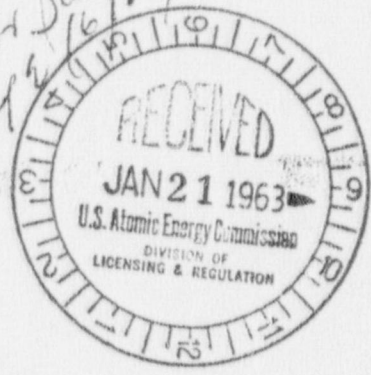

BODEGA BAY

WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission has given its approval for the construction of an atomic power plant by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company on Bodega Head, and

WHEREAS, Bodega Head has been considered a prime area for the University of California Marine Biological Station and the Bodega Bay area has been recommended as a State Park as early as 1956, and

WHEREAS, the presence of the PG&E atomic facility on Bodega Head will diminish or destroy the worth of the biological station as well as remove the proposed State Park area from the public domain, and

WHEREAS, it is further alleged that the presence of the atomic reactor at Bodega Head because of its proximity to the San Andreas fault creates a potential health hazard for the people of Northern California,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the California Democratic Council urge the Public Utilities Commission to grant a pending petition for a rehearing of this matter.
