Dear Mr. Conwayt

Your letter of July 15 and the enclosed report of July 13 from the Atomic Energy Commission on the proposed Bodega nuclear power plant have been considered by Senator Engle. He asked me to thank you for sending the report and to express his hope that the future hazards analysis of the Cosmission's regulatory staff may in fact satisfy the objective of S. J. Res. 167 and H. J. Res. 1008.

This remains to be determined.

Senator Engle observed, for example, that the Commission's report to you signed by Mr. Price speaks only of a required "finding that the issuance of the permit will not, in the opinion of the Commission, be inimical to the health and safety of the public." An express of opinion by the Commission is something less than a certification to the Congress of the geological adequacy and seismicesfety of the Bodega site, as required by the proposed resolution.

Accordingly, it is the Senator's judgment that the objective of the proposed resolution is not being met by the Commission's procedures under present law. For this reason Senator Engle urges that 8. J. Res. 167 receive favorable consideration in order that the Congress may determine the resolution of this crucial public issue.
