1962. (Decision No. 64537, effective November 28, 1962.)
Petitioner's unincorporated predecessor sought rehearing on
November 28, 1962. Rehearing was denied on January 2, 1963.
(Decision No. 64731.) Petitioner's predecessor thereafter filed
petitions alleging violation of the certificate decision and for
injunction. (January 15 and 31, 1963.) Petitions for injunction
were denied on February 13, 1963. (Decision No. 64913.) Thereafter
petitioner filed a petition to reopen the proceeding for further
hearing. (May 6, 1963.) Reopening was denied on July 9, 1963.
(Decision No. 65701.)

On July 31, 1963 petitioner The Northern California
Association to Preserve Bodega Head and Harbor, Inc. filed the
present petition for rehearing of the order denying reopening.
The Commission having considered said petition and each of its



allegations, and being of the opinion that no good cause has been shown for the granting therof, IT IS ORDERED that said petition is hereby denied.

" It was the third denial of etitions filed by the Northrn California Association to reserve Bodega Head and larbor, Inc., and the second ime Bennett has cast the one dissenting vote.

In its 4-to-1 ruling yesteray, the Commission said imply that the latest petiion failed to show cause why ; should reconsider the perait it has already granted 'acific Gas and Electric Comany to build the atomic lant.

The Commission previousy rejected the association's etitions for reviewing on anuary 2 and July 9, and n February 13 it turned own a petition for an inanction.

David Pesonen, executive ecretary for the conservaionist group, said the Comaission's latest denial was ot a defeat.

"It is simply the last adainistrative procedure we just follow before we take he matter to the Supreme 'ourt," he said.

Nearly 200 persons, meanmile, attended an informalonal hearing on the nuclear ower plant before the Main Board of Supervisors.

- 1. What will be the biological effect of temperature fluctuation and chemical issuance?

- 5. Where does one place aesthetic values . . .?
