Philip Crame, attorney for PGSE, called me this afternoon to impulse whether how Techer could accord the ACRE meeting on hodege. I told him that so fer as I know the cituation had not changed since our previous consideration of this question and accordingly there was no basis for changing our provious opinion that Tooker's attendance at the ACRS meeting would involve a violation of the conflict of interest statutes. He asked whether Tocher might appear on his own behalf ("as an independent agent"). I told him that mornally only persons associated with the applicant or the ARC Magnlatery Staff were permitted to attend ACRS meetings and that Bother could not attend as an "independent agent" unless he was invited by the Committee. Crame indicated that while he agreed with the views I had expressed he was raising the question egain because Tocher would be the logical one to amount questions which they thought would be raised by the ACES.

Crame also inquired whether Tocher could testify at the bearing. I indicated that we had referred this question to our Assistant General Councel who deals with these questions for his opinion, but have not as yet received a reply. He asked to be informed promptly if there was any question as to whether Tocher could testify at the hearing.
