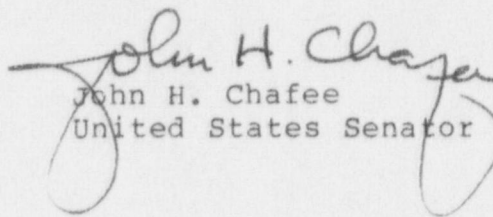
Dear Mr. Zech:
