Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. 552, the Government Accountability Project (GAP) requests copies of any and all agency records and information, including but not limited to notes, letters, memoranda, drafts, minutes, diaries, logs, calanders, tapes, transcripts, summaries, interview reports, procedures, instructions, engineering analyses, drawings, files, graphs, charts, maps, photographs, agreements, hadnwritten notes, studies, data sheets, notebooks, books, telephones messages, computations, voice recordings, computer runoffs, and any other data compilations, interim and/or final reports, status reports, and any and all other records relevant to and/or generated in connection with the dismissal of a health physicist for "whistleblowing" at the Beach Bottom nuclear plant as reported by the Associated Press on December 30, 1986 (see enclosed). This request covers records generated both before and after the release of the report, as well as any records generated in connection with this request.

This request includes all agency records as defined in 10 C.F.R. 9.3a(h) and the NRC Manual, Appendix 0211, Parts 1.A.2 and A.3 (approved October 8, 1980) whether they currently exist in the NRC offical, "working investigative or other files, or at any other location, including private residences.

If any records as defined in 10 C.F.R. 9.3a(b) and the NRC Manual, sucra, and covered by this request have been destroyed and/or removed after this request, please provide all surrounding records, including but not limited to a list of all records which have been or are destroyed and/or removed, a description of the action(s) taken relevant to, generated in connection with and/or issued in order to implement the action(s).

A nuclear power plant employee exposed to radiation at the Peach Bottom nuclear plant was laid off because he notified the Nuclear Regulatory Committee of the incident, an NRC spokesman says.

However, Philadelphia Electric Company, which owns 42.5 percent of the Piace Bottom plant, said the employee, a health physicist, was dismissed in a cuttate at the plant that reduced the work force from 130 employees to 90.

The federal regulatory agency will review the case and release its findings by the end of next month at the earliest, according to Rob Ballo, NRC section the peach Bottom plant, which is located near the Marylander.

"This has a chilling effect on employees at all nuclear power plants," Salin

"If they feel they will lose their jobs if they speak to the NRC, eventually there could be potential problems at the plant that we wouldn't find out accur, he said.

A 1974 federal law prohibits employees at nuclear power plants from being fired for "whistle-blowing," Gallo said.

_An NRC report released in September concluded that the health physicist, is employee of Bartlett Nuclear Inc., a subcontractor at the plant, would not been laid off if he hadn't spoken to the NRC about the March 1985 incident.

A Peach Bottom official told a Bartlett supervisor, "I want the health physicist to go in the first round or layorfs," according to testimony given for

The health physicist and three other employees were exposed to radioactive gas, caused by an equipment malfunction, while examining planned modification in the reactor. The NRC concluded that the levels of radiation to which the workers were exposed were acceptable.

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
