SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION CONCERNING A MATERIAL LICENSE

APPLICATION (REFERENCE: 51249, 030-17845)

This refers to your letter dated September 25, 1986, for renewal of your Byproduct Material License No. 52-19547-01.

Although your current license dated October 15, 1981, is a specific type license with individual users of radioactive material listed in Condition 12, it appears from the correspondence referenced in your letter dated September 25, 1986, that you may be under the impression that your license is a broad-scope type as defined in 10 CFR 33. Broad licenses are issued only to organizations that have considerable prior experience in the use of radioactive materials under specific licenses of limited scope, that have a good performance record based on NRC licensing and inspection of prior activities, that have a radioactive materials utilization program of such scope that the organization needs a variety of radionuclides and operational flexibility to cover numerous uses and users, and that have an administrative organization and procedures appropriate and adequate to ensure safe operations. It appears from your file that your license should remain as a specific license of limited scope.

Your letter dated September 25, 1986, is an alternative to a complete and up-to-date resubmission. Even though this approach is permissible for some licensees, we believe that it would be incomplete in your case. From our review of the referenced submissions listed in your letter dated September 25, 1986, it appears that much of the information described in Regulatory Guide 10.2 (Enclosure 1) may either not be included or not be up-to-date.

Accordingly, we are enclosing a copy of Regulatory Guide 10.2, Revision 1, December 1976. Please follow the instructions contained in this guide and resubmit your renewal application in entirety.

In order to continue prompt review of your application, we request that you submit your response to this letter within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of this letter.
