
Dear Mr. Grimsley:

Records Requested

1. Any records indicating whether HCA Riverton Hospital paid the \$2,500 penalty or requested a hearing and, if the latter, the date, place, and time of the hearing. (See 52 FR 23380.)

2. A copy of the underlying inspection report which lead up to the penalty.

3. HCA Riverton Hospital's letters to NRC dated February 12 and 13, 1987.

4. Any records from officials of the State of Wyoming, or records of conversations with such officials, indicating the proposed penalty was "unreasonable".

5. Any records of NRC employees indicating the amount of penalty, if any, that should be imposed, if such amount is other than \$2,500.

6. Any records showing civil monetary penalties assessed against hospitals since July 1, 1986, including the amount and rationale. (If the notice of the proposed imposition was published in the Federal Register, a FR citation is adequate for this portion of the request.)

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
