The purpose of this letter is to revise the schedule for completion of a previous regulatory commitment. In Reference (a), Northeast Nuclear Energy Company (NNECO) provided responses to the Little Harbor Consultants, Inc. recommendations noted in Reference (b). In response to recommendation 4 of Reference (a), we committed (B16783-4) to: "Evaluate the performance of the Executive Review Board (ERB) in ensuring that personnel, both NNECO and contractors, receive due process and that the disciplinary decisions are consistent and not retaliatory by July 1, 1998."

The scheduled completion date for the evaluation of the performance of the ERB is revised from July 1, 1998, to August 14, 1998. This schedule change is necessary because the completion of the effectiveness assessment relative to the NU employees has been deferred pending completion of a database of all NU employees who have been subject to ERB review and action.
