Re: NRC Review of TVA's March 20, 1986 Appendix B Letter

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The December 22 issue of Inside NRC states that the "reasonable-man" review had found that TVA had sufficiently answered NSRS concerns about loose control of construction processes. Our review indicates otherwise; i.e. TVA did not address the concerns cited by NSRS.

Last week I requested that we be provided the NRC documentation of its findings with respect to Item #4 including a listing of documents which were reviewed and led to the NRC's finding that TVA had sufficiently answered NSRS concerns raised in Item #4.

In order to minimize the potential for misunderstanding, it would be helpful if you would provide the NRC's ground rules involving such matters as:

- The classes of documents subject to review by the NRC (e.g. NSRS reports and memoranda existing as of March 20, 1986, NRC inspection reports, employee concerns received by QTC as of March 20, 1986, QTC reports submitted to TVA as of March 20, 1986) and the rationale for not including any such class of documents in the review.
- The criteria used by the NRC in its "reasonable-man" review to determine whether or not TVA had documented support for conclusions stated in its March 20 letter.
