Gentlemen:

In accordance with your application dated May 22, 1987, as supplemented on June 12, 1987, and letter dated May 22, 1987, and pursuant to Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 40, Source Material License No. SUB-1010 is hereby amended to incorporate the following:

- o Revision No. 4, Sequoyah Facility Radiological Contingency Plan; and
- o Residential Telephone Survey and Emergency Notification Provisions.

Accordingly, Condition 9 is revised to include the date of May 22, 1987, and Condition 22 is revised to include the dates of May 22 and June 12, 1987.

As a result of this licensing action and in order to reflect current commitments and requirements in your license, Conditions 38 and 46 have been deleted since they are no longer applicable nor appropriate.

All other conditions of this license shall remain the same.

Please note that Revision No. 4 to the Sequoyah Facility Radiological Contingency Plan is being incorporated into the license in lieu of a response to staff's comments and concerns in the enclosed Safety Evaluation Report. We suggest that these items be clarified or better defined in the next Contingency Plan revision.

Also, Region IV forwarded a letter to you on May 21, 1987, requesting that a statement accompany each Contingency Plan revision stating that changes have been reviewed and approved and do or do not decrease the response effectiveness of the Plan. You responded by letter dated June 24, 1987, stating that such a statement does accompany each revision in accordance with License Condition 22. However, this statement did not accompany your submittal of Revision 4. We emphasize that this statement should be included in future revisions to the Plan.

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Notwithstanding, based on our review of the revisions to your Radiological Contingency Plan, we have determined that the changes do not decrease its response effectiveness. As indicated in a letter from NRC Region IV to Sequoyah Fuels Corporation, dated June 26, 1987, Region IV staff has reviewed Revision 4 to the Plan and concluded that the changes do not appear to decrease the response effectiveness of the Plan.

This amendment, in part, is issued for the convenience of the Commission to maintain up-to-date references to the Plan in your license.

A copy of Amendment No. 14 to License No. SUB-1010 and the Safety Evaluation Report is enclosed.
