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FITNESS FOR DUTY SUMMARY REPORT JANUARY 1, 1998 TO JUNE 30, 1998

SYNOPSIS:

During this reporting period, IES Utilities Inc/Duane Arnold Energy Center (DAEC) conducted 1056 drug/alcohol tests in accordance with 10 CFR Part 26. A refueling outage during this period accounts for the sharp increase in testing activity over the previous two reporting periods. The breakdown of this period's testing activity is:

IES Utilities follows regulatory guidelines for types of substances and cut-off levels as provided in 10 CFR Part 26, Appendix A. The random testing rate for this period was just under 30 percent of the average population. Positive test rate for all testing was .76%.

Thirty specimens were determined by electronic refractometer measurement at time of collection to be below the specific gravity cut-off level (1.003). Additional specimens were collected under observed conditions for each individual as soon as was possible. All specimens were packaged separately and sent to the reference lab for testing. In one case (short-term contractor), both specimens tested positive for cocaine. All remaining specimens were negative. One specimen result was returned as negative but low creatinine (without also being low specific gravity) - another specimen was collected from the individual under observed conditions and sent to the lab, with negative results. There were no low temperature specimens. Whenever additional specimens were collected, only the result of the second specimen was included in the above totals.

Three individuals confirmed positive for alcohol - two by second breath analysis and one by further confirmation by blood test.

Two of these were for-cause tests based on observed behavior (odor of alcohol), and one was preaccess. There were four positive THC and one positive cocaine test results. All of the above were short-term contractors for the refuel outage. The drug positives were all pre-access tests. There were no positive random test results during this period.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS TAKEN:

All positive pre-access tests resulted in denial of unescorted access. All positive for-cause tests resulted in revocation of unescorted access.

One utility employee tested negative on a for-cause test.

One long term contractor tested at a detectable level for alcohol on a for-cause test. Unescorted access was suspended until completion of a substance abuse evaluation and management/medical review. No specific recommended treatment was determined by the EAP. Access was reinstated. In accordance with FFD Procedure, the individual was placed in a three month follow-up testing program, which he satisfactorily completed.
