Hearing Soon On PG&E

A public hearing on the controversial proposal to build a nuclear power plant at Bodega

Bay will be beld in California soon, the Atomic Energy Commission announced today.

The hearing will be brought to California because of the controversial nature of the proposal, the AEC said. The exact date has not been set.

Ordinarily, hearings are held in Washington, D.C., as a matter of routine when there is no controversy.

The AEC said the application for a permit to operate the plant had been filed by Pacific Gas and Electric Co. and will be reviewed by the commission's regulatory staff and the advisory committee on

The Atomic Energy Commission yesterday appounced it will

hold a public hearing in California on the nuclear reactor power plant proposed at Bodega Bay by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

Time and place will be announced later.

Also yesterday the California Public Utilities Commission, which had already approved the project, denied two petitions for a rehearing. One of the petitions was submitted by University biochemistry professor John B. Neilands, who had charged the PG&E reactor would harm the University's proposed biology station.

The commission ruled that "after considering every allegation, it is of the opinion that no good cause for a rehearing has been made."

Both the Public Utilities Commission and the Atomic Energy Commission must approve the PG&E project.

There has been vigorous opposition to the proposed PG&E reactor, with a good part of it centered on the University.

Neilands charged yesterday that the AEC hearings are just "win dow dressing" and the "whole thing is a charade."

But he add that both he and "a number of people" are going to attend the hearings. "It is necessary to make the protest and expose the phoniness of the so-called regulations of the AEC," he said.

Neilands said he felt there is "no possibility that PG&E's permit will be denied."

A spokesman for the Chancellor's office said University personnel will be allowed to appear before the hearings as individuals but they would not necessarily be representing the University.

representing the University.

Before the ADC hearing PG&E's permit application must be reviewed by the commission's regulatory staff and the advisory committee on reactor safeguards.

The advisory committee will review the safety studies and facilities and advise the commission on the proposed facilities and the adequacy of the reactor safety standards, an AEC spokesman said.

He added that the advisory committee report will be public record.

Former Berkeley Chancellor Glenn T. Seaborg is chairman of the AEC, but he will not be present at the hearing.
