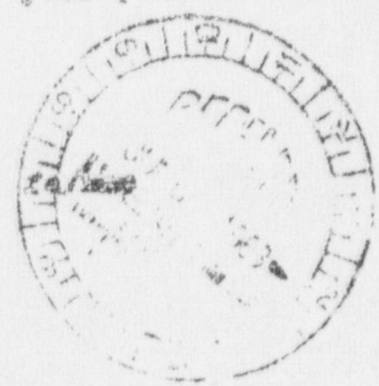


Dear Secretary Udall:

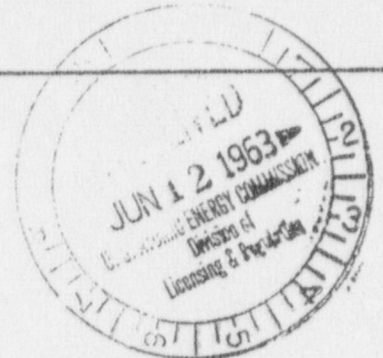

Dear Mr. Secretary:

My admiration for your long-range philosophy has been growing as your views on conservation became more outspoken. I was therefore much gratified to see you express your concern regarding the proposed Redwood Head nuclear power plant, and happy to see you offer the services of the Geological Survey in this matter.

I trust you will not waver in your concern for the welfare of the present and future generations of citizens in this country under the tremendous pressure which will undoubtedly be exerted on you by the nuclear equipment industry, the uranium mining industry, and the AEC. Because of this pressure from large groups with money to spend, the citizens of this area have not had proper consideration of their wishes and objections at the local and state level.

As long as the disposal of "hot" wastes is not solved, it is morally inexcusable to bequeath this problem to posterity. Some of these wastes have to be stored for about 600 years; nuclear power plants will add to these wastes continually. What a legacy for our coming generations!

My continued support and best wishes for your conservation program are tendered herewith.
