RESPONSE (TAC NO. 67460)

By memorandum dated February 22, 1988, you requested that NRR provide clarification of staff fire protection requirements/guidelines pertaining to fire brigade response. The question specifically is; should the fire brigade be assembled and/or dispatched to an area of possible fire occurrence upon receipt of a fire alarm or should a fire be confirmed first by a plant operator sent to the scene?

Attached as enclosure 1 is our complete response to your request. In general, for those plants licensed to the guidelines contained in "Nuclear Plant Fire Protection Functional Responsibilities, Administrative Controls and Quality Assurance" the fire brigade should at least be assembled "upon report of a fire or receipt of an alarm." For plants licensed to the guidelines contained in Branch Technical Position BTP CMEB 9.5-1 licensees have the option to send an operator to confirm a fire prior to summoning the brigade.
