

Gentlemen:

This letter and the enclosed 3M customer site summary survey forms are in response to telephone requests by Mr. James Lynch on April 24, 1989. These requests were confirmed in Dr. Bruce Mallet's letter of April 27, 1989. Although Dr. Mallet's letter indicates it was his understanding that we would be providing a comprehensive listing of 3M customer site surveys, our understanding, which was subsequently discussed in a telephone conversation with Mr. Lynch on May 1, 1989, is that we are to supply you with the summary survey forms for those customers where contamination was found in their facilities. To date, approximately 4,200 total customer surveys have been performed of which 362 343 showed contamination, were cleaned, and released for unrestricted use. The summary survey forms for those 362 343 customers are enclosed.

Dr. Mallet's letter also requested a list of all static eliminators which have not been returned, including those which have been reported as "lost". This list was sent to Mr. Lynch by Federal Express on April 25, 1989.
